

ROGUES SWEEP BRAVES SERIES; PLAY FOUR GAMES AT WILLOWS

Marysville, Cal., May 12 — (Special to Mail Tribune)—Medford Rogues today were tied for first place in the Far West Baseball league through their third straight victory over Marysville and with the aid of Pittsburgh who knocked over the Klamath Falls Geins.

The Medford club tallied five runs in the first two innings last night to give it a 5 to 3 win over the Braves and thereby gain a clean sweep of the three-game stay in Marysville.

Tied For First Spot
Tonight the Rogues open a four-game series at Willows with single games this evening and Saturday night and a double-header there on Sunday. The Rogues now are tied with Pittsburgh for first place and Klamath Falls which had led the league is now second.

Three unearned runs in the first inning for the Rogues started off the Medford victory last night. Russ Stuart reached on an error when the Braves second baseman dropped his pop fly, stole second and scored when Bill Adams singled.

Adams went to second on the throw-in to the plate and after Milt Martin and Marc Guglielmo each had grounded out, Don Williams went to second on a two-base error, scoring Adams, and when Al Bolen singled, Williams tallied the third Medford run.

Haddock Gets Single
Medford picked up another run in the second inning when Bob Haddock singled, Floyd Shotwell sacrificed, Stuart beat out an infield hit and Adams singled in Haddock.

Bolen doubled off the left field fence in the one-run third stanza for Medford and Cooney singled him home. Williams got a single in the fourth inning for Medford's only other hit in the baseball game.

Pitcher Ed Thompson, who relieved starter Shotwell in the fourth, allowed three hits but a bit of wildness in the ninth inning decided Player Manager Tommy Nelson of the Rogues to send in Keith Bowman to "put out the fire."
