

DISTRICT TRACK MEET AT HIGH SCHOOL ON SATURDAY

Junior High Trackmen Outpoint Ashlanders By Score of 68 to 54

Medford junior high trackmen captured another dual track victory yesterday afternoon when the local youths scored a 68 to 54 decision over Ashland junior high on the Lithia city's field.

A triangular meet with Ashland and Grants Pass comes next week.

Original tally of the results did not list nine points for Medford in the high hurdles but recapitulation with Coach Mel Bolderenow of Medford this morning added in these nine points.

The local crew would have won 58 to 54 under the original scoring.

meet opens at 10 a.m. at the Medford high field. Finals will start at 3 p.m.

Observers have predicted that the fans looking on tomorrow will see several records broken as well as seeing boys who will represent this district in the state track meet at Corvallis next week-end. Boys and relay teams place first and second will go to Corvallis.

Track Rated Best
Groundskeeper Jack Cummings says that the track will be in the best condition it has ever seen and that plus the fact that some of the fastest high school runners in Oregon will be competing could mean new records.

Schools expected to take part in addition to the Black Tornado are Grants Pass, Klamath Falls, Central Point, Illinois Valley, Eagle Point and Lakeview.

Spectators attending will enter only through the new or east grandstand. Entrances on the west side will be open to officials and competitors only.

While only the first two in each event will be eligible for the state track meet, those finishing third and fourth will be alternates and could compete if one or other of the first two can not take part.

Prelims Scheduled
In all field events two throws or jumps will be taken by each school until four have been taken in the morning preliminaries.

In the afternoon finals the best six in each event will take three more throws or jumps.

Last year Medford placed 11 men in nine events in the district meet and then went on to win the state championship.

This year the Tornado and Klamath Falls are figured to be top teams here with each placing many boys.

Events to watch especially tomorrow for excitement include high hurdles, shot put, discus and the 880-yard relay.

This year the meet will be divided into two classes—A and B—with seventh and eighth graders in class A and grades four, five and six in grade B.

Where To Fish

Portland, Ore., May 13—(U.P.)—The Oregon State game commission today issued the following fishing forecast:

Douglas county—Trout angling continued good in lakes and larger rivers. Stream conditions improving rapidly. Angling should be good this week end. Salmon fishing in lower Umpqua improved but still slow. Bass being taken most lakes on both surface and deep lures. Perch and other pan fish taken readily.

Upper Umpqua—Water conditions improved. Trout fishing good. Bait and spinner still most productive, but good catches being made on bucktail and caddis flies. Salmon catches erratic. Some salmon being taken nearly all sections Umpqua river.

Upper Rogue—Salmon fishing prospects good from Galice to Savage Rapids. Only fair salmon fishing expected in Gold Hill area. Trout fishing should be good most Rogue tributaries and in main stream from McCloud downstream. Best trout catches on brown hackle flies and single eggs.

Several local favorites will have spots on the card. One of the matches drawing considerable attention is the semi-wind-up between Bob Stumbo, Wolf Creek, and Al Offord, Medford, for the southern Oregon heavyweight title.

Other title fights will see Donovan Wolfe risk his light-heavyweight crown against Rocky Sanger, Eugene; John Law, Oakland, posting his lightweight crown against Ray Stickle, and Jim Puscas, Eugene, giving Dick Adkins, Griffin Creek, a chance to regain his southern Oregon lightweight title.
