If I believed or feared I were developing acute sore throat, or I'd use a mouthwash or gargle. Certainly I would not use one in the fatuous fancy that it could possibly abort, stop or relieve the sore throat or other symptoms of the C-R-1—any common respiratory infection.
I am as ignorant as you are, stupid, about a great many things, but I happen to know that no antiseptic or germ-killing substance a person can use will destroy disease germs or even prevent them from multiplying when the germs are in the tissues. No remedy or nostrum "penetrates" the surface "go to work" on the germs that are causing the trouble. This is true, no matter how powerful the nostrum looks or smells. It is true, no matter how good an actress the "nurse" is who poses for the pretty picture. It is true, no matter how eminent the "scientist" looks there at his microscope.
In any case the use of mouthwash, gargle or spray can accomplish no more than momentary washing away of secretions on the mucous membrane surface. It is indeed questionable whether such unnatural washing of mucous membrane surfaces does good or harm. In my own opinion—I acknowledge I may be unduly prejudiced—it is better to do nothing at all than it is to overdo the business of gargling or spraying as so many misguided wiseacres do.
I get a chuckle out of the handsome magazine pictures of poor geeks getting their feet wet—and the suggestion to lose not an instant's time starting the gargle routine with the powerful smelling "antiseptic." But the chuckle is of brief duration when I think of how much the geeks might save if they were not so gullible. Not only about "antiseptic" nostrums but about scores of other things they think they must use in everyday living—things that are not worth shelf room in a well regulated household.
