Pennsylvania Town Would Be Capital Case of Emergency

Perryopolis, Pa.—(UP)—This little Pennsylvania town is ready to become the nation's "emergency" capital if the H-bomb ever forces government leaders to leave Washington.

In the event of an A-bomb or H-bomb attack on the District of Columbia, the 1,000 residents of Perryopolis have made a standing invitation to the government to "move in with us." They still believe that George Washington, founder of the town, was right when he called Perryopolis (then known as New Boston) the ideal place for a capital city.

Surveyed Town. Washington helped survey and plan the building of the town, bought a tract near the center of the village and arranged for all streets to lead into it, as

they do today. Some congressional, military and business leaders have urged that government offices be dispersed from their present concentration in Washington. They argue that an A-bomb or H-bomb attack would paralyze government functions.

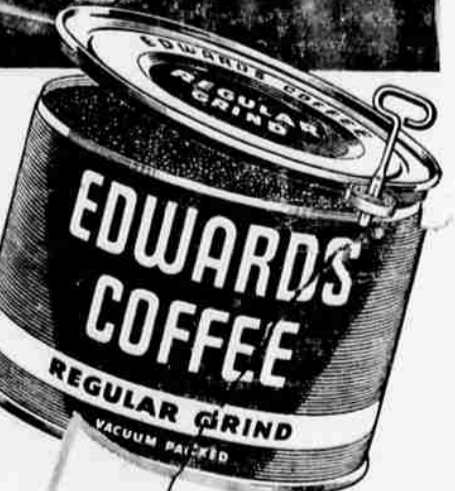
