

Voters Will Choose Nominees Friday At Primary Elections

Friday, May 19, is primary election day in Oregon. Voters of both parties will be asked to choose the democratic and republican nominees for national, state, county and district offices. Polls will be open from 9 a. m. to 9 p. m. DST (8 a. m. to 8 p. m. standard time) on Friday. A complete list of Jackson county polling places will be listed, by precincts, in tomorrow's edition of The Mail Tribune.

Three Ballots
In Medford, voters will be confronted with three ballots—the nominating ballot of their own party, a non-partisan judiciary ballot for position No. 3 of the state supreme court, and a municipal ballot, which provides

for a \$2,800,000 bond issue for water department improvement, a \$125,000 bond issue for fire department expansion, modernization and improvement, and a four-mill continuing levy for fire department personnel and maintenance.

In Ashland, there will also be three ballots, with the city ballot carrying three measures, recall of Mayor Thomas S. Williams, recall of Councilman Elmer Sheldon, and a charter amendment to permit sale of city-owned timber land to the forest service.

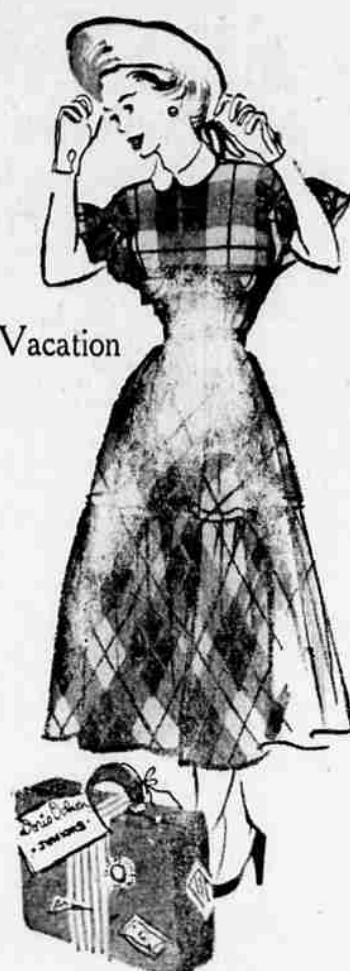
