Democratic Committee Favors Law Changes

Portland, Ore., May 18—U.P. The democratic state central committee was on record today as favoring election law changes to permit use of registrars in each precinct to sign up voters. The committee adopted a resolution in a lightly-attended meeting here Saturday under which each party would recommend persons to county clerks for appointment as registrars.

Woman Prisoner's Suicide Try Foiled

Albany, Ore., May 18—U.P. Mrs. Mina Dee Scott, 50, held in the city jail on a drunken driving charge, attempted to hang herself Saturday night, officers reported.

Mrs. Scott was cut down when police discovered she had tied her blouse to a cell bar. Officers handcuffed her to the cell door to prevent another attempt.

She was arrested late Friday after an accident in which two children riding with her were injured. Police said she refused to allow a doctor to attend the five-year-old boy injured in the crash.

Doukhobors Blamed For Bridge Bombing

Grand Forks, B. C., May 18—U.P. A Canadian Pacific railway bridge was bombed today and provincial police blamed the "Sons of Freedom," a radical branch of the Doukhobors religious sect.

The bombing followed the arrest yesterday of 40 "Sons of Freedom" for nudism. Police said the bombing apparently was an act of revenge.

Railroad officials said the bridge across the Kettle river would be unusable for several days. The latest arrests, including 13 women, were made on nudism charges dating back to April 30.

Judith Coplon Plans To Marry Attorney

New York May 18—U.P. Judith Coplon, former government girl convicted on espionage charges in Washington and New York, said today she expected to be married "within the next few weeks" to Albert H. Socolov, an associate of her court-appointed attorneys.

Miss Coplon, 29, is free on bail pending appeal of both her convictions. She said she met Socolov in the law office of Neuburger, Shapiro, Rabinowitz and Boudin.

MY DEAR OBSTETRICIAN

A firm of automobile makers tells us the so-and-so car is the common meeting ground for the world's most distinguished people and urges us to visit the dealer now and add our name to the distinguished list. The funny part of this is that a good many persons of fair repute respond to such suggestion, not just the gamblers

and crooks.

Many communications from Yankee Wisecracks, the customers of trick "specialists," quote for my information (being just an ordinary doctor I should be grateful to the Wisecracks for enlightenment), what "my obstetrician" or "my pediatrician" or "my psychiatrist" says, and apparently the Wisecracks assume that the specialist's pronouncement will settle my hash.

Without purporting to be any better qualified to have an opinion upon a question of medicine than a hundred thousand "ordinary" doctors, I may say that in my judgment the opinions and the principles of most "ordinary" doctors in practice are fully as sound and dependable as those of trick specialists.

By "trick specialist" I mean a doctor who competes with the honest practitioners of the community for public patronage. He tricks the public, or the gullible portion of the population, into believing that because he calls himself a "specialist" he knows more or has greater skill than the "ordinary" doctor, the family doctor, the honest general practitioner.

According to the medical directory compiled by the national medical organization there are approximately 100,000 physicians in practice—not counting those filling salaried jobs in various services and institutions—and of these nearly half (over 40,000) are specialists. If the figures are accurate, then I venture to estimate that less than 5,000 of the practitioners who hold themselves out as specialists are real specialists.

By "real specialist" I mean the doctor who engaged in general practice for five or 10 years, became particularly interested in a special field of practice, took a leave of absence to pursue a course of post-graduate study in that special field, and finally withdrew from general practice and limited his practice to his chosen special field. He announced his limitation of practice to his medical colleagues. His only public announcement was that under his name on his professional sign, card or office door: Practice limited to . . . whatever specialty he had chosen. The real specialist is hard to find these days, in the rack of trick "specialists" who employ every means to attract customers away from the family doctor.

The real specialist first gains and then holds the respect and confidence of his colleagues, and they refer patients or call him in consultation with them in difficult cases. The real specialist gives the doctor his opinion or advice or counsel or skill, but does not try to supplant the doctor as physician to the patient or family. The real specialist is a doctor's doctor. We need real specialists as much as ever, but I sincerely believe our people would be better off, economically and in health, if the 35,000 trick "specialists" now infesting

the country were exposed as ethical quacks.

QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

Woman sixty-five. Could a woman aged 65 who had her menopause sixteen years ago possibly have a baby if she remarried now? (Mrs. R. M. T.)

Answer—Anything is possible except a mouse's nest in the cat's ear, but in practically all instances a woman who has had the menopause can no longer conceive.

Acid Condition My Eye. Daughter, 7, has an acid condition. Please tell me the cause and what diet. (Mrs. P. C.)

Answer—That's an odd notion. Better give the child the benefit of proper medical attention, and spare the doctor your funny notion about "acid condition."

Club Foot. Man I am about to marry had club foot at birth. He is one of seven children and none of the others have it. Would it be transmitted to our children? (Miss L. A.)

Atlantic Powers Renew USSR Threat

London, May 18—(U.P.)—The North Atlantic treaty powers reviewed the Russian threat to the western world today and discussed in general the urgent steps they would take to prevent another war.

The foreign ministers of the 12 countries met at Lancaster house for the fourth session of the North Atlantic council since the treaty was signed. The talks will go on all this week.

Tomorrow the ministers will tackle the specific problems of defense and financing the west's rearmament program.

The talks were going on in secret. A member of a delegation representing one of the big powers said:

"We can't tell the enemy what we are talking about."

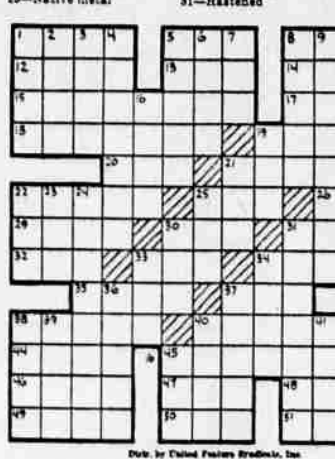
