

## Comedian Max Patkin Here Thursday Night

"A natural comic and contortionist" will be seen in Medford Thursday night when Max Patkin, famous throughout the country as a baseball comedian, will put on his act during the Medford Rogues vs. Pittsburg Diamonds at the fairgrounds park starting about 7:45 p.m.

His repertoire includes first base coaching tricks, sideline tomfoolery, imitations and various body contortions which finds him twisting his loose-jointed body like a pretzel.

Unwinds Self

On the mound Patkin twists himself up like a Boy Scout's neckerchief knot, unwinds suddenly and out of a conglomeration of arms and legs something

appears. Often times it is a baseball but frequently it will be a glove or shoe.

Patkin appears capable of nearly anything but his imitation is perhaps his greatest laugh-provoker. It may be the way the first baseman throws and fields, or the batter's uneasy stance.

On occasions he gives an all too accurate imitation of the umpire's gesture which might find him getting the thumb to the delight of the fans.

Although he confines most of his efforts to pantomimes, Patkin can't resist an occasional quick retort. Should the umpire throw up his arms and shout "Time," Patkin is more than apt to glance quickly at his wrist watch and yell "about a quarter to four."

The louder the crowd laughs the funnier Patkin gets.

Business Manager Mel Carpenter of the Rogues has announced that there will be no extra charge for Thursday night's game. He advised fans to get tickets and be at the park early to be sure of a good seat and present when the fun begins.

Ted Anderson, Newport, ran a 21.7 race in the 220-yard dash in district trials to surpass the state record and the fleet Medford relay team equaled the state record of 1:31.2 set by another Medford quartet in 1948.

Vancouver collected 13 hits off Indian hurler Dick Bishop in the rout. The game was the second no-hit no-run contest in the class 'B' league's 13-year history.

Nicholas didn't let a man past first base, only seven balls got out of the infield and he struck out seven Spokane batters.

Nicholas, who said it was his first no-hitter in pro ball, said he relied mainly on his sinking fast ball and a slider.
