

AROUND HOLLYWOOD

Hollywood, May 18—(U.P.)—Here's one for the "how-ambitious-can-you-get?" department:

A Hollywood press agent has up and invited 47 big-shot railroad presidents to help him out with a publicity stunt.

He wants 'em to smear on grease-paint, paste fake beards on their chins, crawl into movie costumes, and play bit parts in a phony train robbery next Tuesday.

The press agent with these high-falutin' ideas is John Del Valle, tub-thumper for producer Nat Holt. John thinks snagging 47 railroad presidents for their movie, "The Great Missouri Raid," would be a very fine thing.

He thinks snagging even one railroad president would be a very fine thing. And he's gonna be a mighty disappointed press

agent if the big shots turn him down.

He figures they owe it to his boss.

"Mr. Holt is the screen's leading glamorizer of pioneer railroad epics," Del Valle says. "He hardly ever makes a picture without some period railroad scene in recognition of the great part the railroads had in opening up the west."

"Any railroad president with an acute sense of public relations is bound to accept. And their business could use a little glamorizing right now."

The invited, all decorated with fancy red and green pictures of galloping bandits, went out Monday to men like G. Metzner, president of the New York Central system; F. G. Gurley, of the Atchafalpa, Topeka and Santa Fe; J. D. Farrington, of the Chicago, Rock Island and Pacific, and Wayne A. Johnston, of the Illinois Central.

Walter J. Tuohy, Chesapeake and Ohio boss, got one, too. So did P. W. Johnston, of the Erie Line, W. A. Mather, Canadian Pacific chief, and A. E. Stoddard, Union Pacific.

"We are going to re-enact the first great train robbery," Del Valle explained. "With historical accuracy—and maybe a little theatrical license. The James boys, Frank and Jesse, pulled it off on July 21, 1873, on the line of the Chicago, Rock Island and Pacific, at Adair, Iowa."

They did it with a handful of bandits and nobody around to arrest 'em. Hollywood's "little theatrical license" is tossing in a platoon of movie cavalry to dress it up a little.

They're hiring a lot of horses to make the chase between the cavalry and the robbers more breath-taking.

Del Valle approaches the stunt with no little awe and excitement and he says his movie James boys—Wendell Corey and MacDonald Carey—feel the same way.

"We want the railroad presidents to ride in one of the coaches and get held up," he says happily. "We will even supply them with wallets stuffed with stage money to accommodate the James boys."

So far none of the railroad presidents has indicated a y engerness to cavort behind an ancient woodburner locomotive for a technicolor stick-up.

But Del Valle, a hopeful man, keeps haunting the mail box.

Plastic Shoes Help in Getting Accurate Fit

Boston—(U.P.)—Transparent plastic try-on shoes which can be used to determine the accuracy of shoe fitting without X-rays and their dangers have been invented by Dr. Joseph Lelyveld, chairman of the National Foot Health Council.

He said the new method is primarily for children to prevent foot defects caused by shoes that crowd the toes or do not fit the heel. Parents and fitter will be able to observe a full view of the entire foot in the plastic shoes, which will duplicate leather shoes in all sizes and widths.

The try-on shoes have flexible leather soles and heels so the child can walk to test the fit.
