**FOR U. S. SENATOR**—Senator Wayne L. Morse, republican incumbent, defeated Farmer Dave Hoover in a slam-bang campaign for the republican nomination for the United States senate in Friday's primary election. Howard Latourette, Portland attorney and former democratic party officer, defeated ex-Prof. Louis Wood, Eugene, in the democratic primaries. They will compete for election in November. **GUBERNATORIAL CANDIDATES**—Republican Incumbent Douglas McKay, above left, will face State Sen. Austin Flegel in the November general election for the governorship of Oregon. Flegel beat out two other democratic candidates, State Treasurer Walter J. Pearson and former-State Sen. Lew Wallace in Friday's primary election.



**STATE SENATOR CANDIDATES**—Both aspirants for Jackson county's seat in the Oregon state senate were unopposed at the primary election. They will face each other in the general election in November. **RUN FOR CONGRESS**—Harris Ellsworth, at left above, Roseburg, the present congressman from the fourth Oregon district, had no opposition for the republican nomination for re-election. The democratic primary election, however, was a stiff battle all the way between Walter Swanson, Springfield merchant, and David Shaw, Gold Beach attorney and former government employee. Returns available late Saturday gave Shaw a lead of slightly more than 1,500. He had overcome an early lead by Swanson, and his advantage had been increasing slowly. **IN RACE FOR SHERIFF**—The two candidates for sheriff of Jackson county in the general election are pictured above. At left is Sheriff Howard Gault, who defeated Real Estate Man Ray Marks in the primary, and at right is W. L. "Bill" Taylor, Central Point dairyman and farmer, who defeated Police Officer Delroy Alder-shof.

**New Auto-Buying Plan Announced by Firm**  
The M and M Hudson company here has inaugurated a new form of merchandising—flying customers to the manufacturing center to take delivery of a new automobile—in cooperation with other firms in the northwest.

The plan makes it possible for a man and wife to buy a new Hudson from the dealer here, and instead of waiting for delivery by rail, fly to Detroit via Northwest airlines. Flights leave each Sunday, with the first one scheduled for June 11. The plan includes all transportation for two, \$25,000 insurance, meals, hotel bills, a tour of the Hudson factory and a return vacation allowance.

**Copco Earnings Up For 12-Month Period**

The California Oregon Power company last week reported a net income of \$2,110,947 for the 12 months ending April 30, 1950. This compares to \$2,066,466 for the same period the year previous, an increase of 2.15 per cent. Net income was equivalent to 5.09 times preferred stock dividend requirements and, after deduction for such dividends, was equivalent to \$2.12 per share on common stock. Net income for this period was 20.59 per cent of gross operating revenues. Net income for the month of April amounted to \$194,996 compared with \$144,695 for April, 1949, an increase of 34.76 per cent. Key West, Fla. (AP)—Earl Weston of Detroit arrived here in a car equipped with a mobile transmitter and receiver. He called a friend who guided him around town, pointing out the sights by remote control. Then he directed Weston to a motor court and signed off for the night.
