Portland, Ore., May 22—(UP) Throughout the state many tight municipal races drew more than casual interest as returns continued to pour in from scattered precincts.

At Pendleton in eastern Oregon with 7 of 12 precincts reporting, one of the closest races for mayor was being fought to the wire. Latest count favored Morris Temple, well-known hotelman, by three votes over incumbent Jabin Vaught, 753 to 750.

Peter G. Cosovich won the republican nomination for mayor of Astoria by 300 votes over his nearest opposition and will oppose William Nolan, democrat who ran unopposed, in next fall's general election.

THE MEANING OF PHYSICAL DEGENERATION

Soon after I began to die—we all begin to die somewhere between 30 and 50—a New Jersey chiropractor began to tell his customers and prospective customers that Dr. Brady had turned up his toes years ago and the column published a mine was really written by a syndicate of medical practitioners who used my name to get propaganda over to the public. Every little while after that I was killed off somewhere or other.

When I say we all begin to die I mean the decline, senescence, maturity, involution or degeneration which comes sooner or later to everyone who lives out his or her natural life.

Degeneration is retrograde evolution. Webster says it is "deterioration of a tissue or an organ in which its vitality is diminished; a substitution of a lower for a higher form of structure, either by chemical change of the tissue (true degeneration) or the deposit of abnormal matter in the tissues (infiltration)." Stedman's Medical Dictionary defines degeneration as "a retrogressive pathological change in cells or tissues in consequence of which the function power is lost" (italics mine) "and the living substance becomes converted into an inert mass."

In a morbid way everyone has heard of "fatty degeneration" of the heart. If the very thought of it is depressing let me say that unquestionably we who are about to die, we who are now dying, all have more or less fatty degeneration of the heart—some of the living, functioning cells of heart muscle and arterial walls have replaced by inert fatty material. So we can no longer run as fast or as far as we could when we were younger, nor compete with those who have not begun to die. This is just plain common sense as well as sound pathology. The trouble is that the majority of people fail to recognize the truth about dying. In America, for instance, we sometimes elect to the presidency a man who in all reason should instead be given his place in the chimney corner. Or we send our representatives in a world conference of the gravest importance a man who is obviously on the point of departure to another world, and then we wonder whether the poor man really had enough judgment to know just what he was doing.

The part of Stedman's definition about loss of functioning power is the feature of degeneration, physical degeneration, that you young people should fix in mind. If you wonder whether you are degenerating, growing old, you can get an unbiased answer at any time: Try running a mile, or jumping over a hedge, or chinning yourself, or rolling a somersault, or performing any other physical stunt that you could do when you were in your teens or early adulthood. If you can no longer do it you are growing old, period.

When I lived in Canandaigua I could do handstands and air-springs and chin myself I forget how many times and a few daring stunts on the flying trapeze. Can't do such things now. Every morning when I do my half dozen to a dozen somersaults on the floor I think of the millions of poor old geezers of 40 or 50 or 60 who have grown so old and decrepit that they simply can't do anything they used to do when they were young.

This allusion to rolling somersaults is not facetious. Please don't be so doddering about it. As I explain in the pamphlet "Invitation to the Somersaultauque."

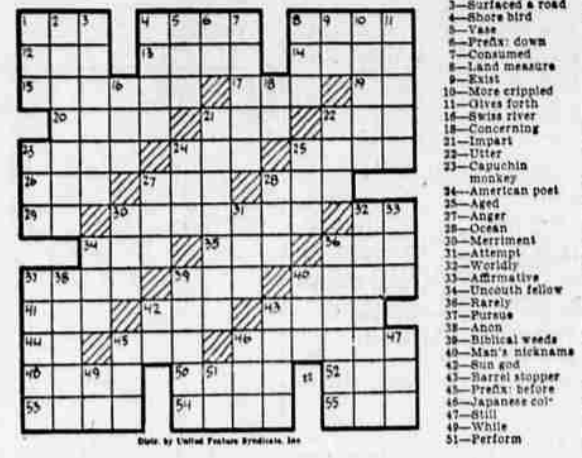
