Employment Office Services Described

(This is the third in a series of five articles about the Oregon state employment service, and the Medford office in particular. The articles were prepared by the OSES here in the belief that effective use of the nation's manpower is one of the main problems of a growing democracy, and that by presenting information, accurately, briefly and clearly, it hopes to make possible the widening of its services to the community, and to workers and employers.—Editor's note.)

community may find suitable employment elsewhere through the clearance program. While migration between areas is the main clearance activity, necessary shifts of workers across occupational or industrial lines also are handled. During the war and afterwards, these procedures have been applied widely, both on area and occupational lines, for recruitment of workers in critical industries and in distant lands.

After recognition of the need for assistance and guidance in a new vocational plan, three main steps are followed by the Medford office: (1) Survey of the applicant's training, abilities and work-history in discovering possible new occupational directions.

(2) Outlining of a new plan for training or vocational development that will result in effective placement in appropriate employment. (3) Check up on new work to determine suitability of job and adjustment of worker to new occupation and working conditions.

Trained employment counselors in local offices are familiar with the variety of vocational training available in most Oregon communities. As most of these occupational adjustments are made at a fairly early age, youth programs are especially important.

Accurate knowledge of the community's economy is also necessary. Are the main work opportunities in agriculture, lumber or food processing? Are they seasonal or year-round in nature? What chance for advancement? Answers to these and thousands of other pertinent questions may be found at your nearest employment office.

Mobility of labor is one of the broad objectives of the Oregon state employment service. This free movement of workers, whether on an intra-state, inter-state or overseas level, is made easier through well defined clearance procedures between the 1,800 offices of the United States employment service.
