

Conditions Said Ideal For Forest Reseeding

Portland, May 27—Nature will reseed plentifully tens of thousands of acres this fall in the Douglas fir forests of Washington and Oregon.

That is the report of W. D. Hagenstein, forest engineer for the forest conservation committee of the Pacific Northwest Forest Industries. He said that a bountiful seed year is in the making. Tiny cones now cover hundreds of millions of trees. They will ripen during the summer.

Conditions are ideal for reseeded Hagenstein reported. Loggers burned much slash last fall and large areas are ready for natural reseeded.

Only fires, Hagenstein said, can spoil this potentially fine year. He urged summer-long alertness and caution by forest users to prevent fires.
