Hoover Campaign Cost \$54,000

Salem, Ore., June 1 (U.P.)—More than \$54,000 was spent in the unsuccessful effort to nominate Dave Hoover of Deadwood, Ore., for United States senator on the republican ticket, reports of campaign expenditures filed with the secretary of state disclosed today.

Backers of Wayne Morse of Eugene, successful in his campaign to succeed himself as senator for the republican nomination, spent more than \$28,000.

These were the largest sums reported so far for primary election campaign expenditures.

Ralph B. Coulson, assistant treasurer of the Hoover for senator committee, Portland, reported expenditures of \$54,005.42. Dave Hoover himself reported no money spent.

E. C. Sammons, treasurer of the Morse for senator campaign, Portland, reported expenditures of \$28,448.09.

Although Douglas McKay was without opposition for the republican nomination to succeed himself as governor, W. L. Phillips, chairman of the McKay for governor club, Salem, reported expenditures of \$7,871.03.
