

## Citation Sets New Records Winning Race

Albany, Cal., June 3—(U.P.)—Calumet Farm's Citation broke two world's records today in the \$20,000 Golden Gate mile, traveling the eight furlongs in an amazing 1:33 3/5 and becoming the greatest money-winning thoroughbred of all time.

Carrying 128 pounds, Citation needed all the speed at his command in winning by a neck over the speedy, surprising Bolero. On Trust, veteran west coast campaigner, was third in a field of six.

Citation's time clipped two-fifths of a second off the previous world's mark for the mile, and there was some talk that the triple crown champion of 1948 was "over the hill." But the husky, five-year-old son of Bull-Lea looked his old self today.

The victory was worth \$14,550, boosting Citation's earnings to \$924,830. The old record of \$918,485 was held by Mrs. Ethel Jacob's Styxie, now retired. Styxie needed 131 races to reach his mark but Citation's race today was only his 38th.

Citation had finished second in each of his last five starts, and there was some talk that the triple crown champion of 1948 was "over the hill." But the husky, five-year-old son of Bull-Lea looked his old self today.
