Corvallis, June 7—Don Fawcett, former Medford high baseball star, has completed a fine first year as regular second baseman on the Oregon State college varsity.

The Medford youth cracked out 16 hits in 56 times at bat in 14 northern division games for a .286 average. He collected three doubles during the campaign. In the fielding department Fawcett was unusually steady for a sophomore, making only five errors in 14 contests. He turned in 35 assists to rank near the top in the conference and started numerous double plays.

Expect Great Things
"Don had a very good year for a sophomore and I am counting on great things from him before he completes his college eligibility," Baseball Coach Ralph Coleman declared in commenting on Fawcett.

A war veteran, Fawcett is 24 years old. He was a standout on the 1949 OSC freshman team which lost only one game.

Last week, Jerald L. Hampel, 24, was sentenced to five years in the state penitentiary for permitting Hendrix to drink liquor in his car before the fatal accident.

Hendricks was driving Hampel's auto when it went off the road, striking and killing Barbara Joan and sending her sister, Jeanette, 11, to a hospital.

Most of the afternoon was taken up by a picnic lunch, registration of members and visitors and social activities. Games and contests concluded the afternoon.

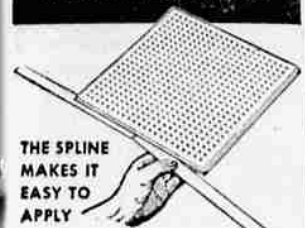
Plans are being made for another similar event next year, also to be held at TouVelle park.
