

Salem Fire Chief Will Remain on Job

Salem, Ore., June 9.—(U.P.)—Fire Chief William P. Roble will remain with the Salem fire department.

Roble had filed his resignation with City Manager J. L. Franzen, but Mayor R. L. Elstrom had refused to accept it.

After a conference with Franzen and Elstrom Wednesday, Roble agreed to remain with the department.

Roble submitted his resignation Monday after conventions of the Oregon State Fire Fighters association and the Oregon Fire Chiefs association. Roble was elected president of the fire fighters, made up of employees of various fire departments, adopted a resolution criticizing the city manager form of government. Roble said his submitted resignation was in part a protest against this action.

In refusing to accept Roble's resignation, Mayor Elstrom said the chief had been instrumental in building Salem's fire department into one of the outstanding in the state.
