

Rogues Lose To Gems by 13-4 Score

Klamath Falls, June 8 (Special to The Mail Tribune)—The Klamath Falls Gems picked up six runs in the first inning here Friday night to get started on the way to a 13 to 4 decision over the Medford Rogues baseball nine in a Far West league game.

The home team knocked Medford's Don Taylor from the mound in the first inning. Klamath's six runs came on two hits, four walks and a hit batter. Carl Hueners went the rest of the route on the hill for Medford, giving up 14 blows.

Medford scored once in the first stanza on consecutive bingles by Russ Stuart, Jack Cooney and Milt Martin. In the eighth Medford got two more, one on Bob Haddock's single and another during a Gem double play. Cooney's single scored Don Williams for the Rogues in the ninth.

Stuart and Cooney got three hits in five times up for Medford.

Andy Sierra, who pitched the distance for Klamath, also hit for three for five and drove in three runs.

Pain-Ridden Hogan Earns Golf Deadlock

Ardmore, Pa., June 10 (U.P.)—Bantam Ben Hogan battled pain and par to a standstill today, and his fighting heart conquered faltering legs to carry him into a three-way tie at 287 with Lloyd Mangrum and George Fazio for the National Open Golf championship.

His trembling legs tormenting him in every throbbing tendon, the tight-lipped little man from the lone star state staggered home through the heat that blanketed Merion Golf club with a four over par last round 37-37

—74 which put him into a triple playoff tomorrow afternoon.

Fazio Leads Way
The balding Fazio—who almost abandoned competitive golf this spring—led the way in with a final round of 70 for his 287. A short time later the dapper Mangrum—a purple heart war hero who won this classic in the lightning and the rain at Cleveland in 1946—matched his total score with a soaring 76.

But out there under the blazing sun, fighting pain and par and heat and hazards, came Hogan. For a time it looked like the tiny Texan might take it all. But it was just too much to ask of this little man who captured America's most coveted golfing prize in 1948 and then almost lost his life in an automobile accident in February of 1949.

Old Will Pays Off
Not since returning to the golf wars this year had Hogan played 36 holes in one day. But now he had to, and only that old will to win brought him home in a dead heat. For after the first 18 holes this morning, he barely was able to get his shoes back on to his swollen feet.

Finally he made, and started the long journey through the heat and the largest crowd in open history, 12,500 tense and feverish fans.
