Unknown Soldier of South Rests Close to Unidentified Union Dead

Raleigh, N. C. (UPI)—In an overgrown little graveyard in Carteret county stands a small, faded tombstone which reads: Unknown Co. B. 26th Regt. C.S.A.

Although no sentry strides in measured steps to guard his resting place, that white stone marks the place of the South's "Unknown Soldier."

It is said that this unknown soldier of the confederacy remains unnamed through the desire of a woman.

Miss Emeline Pogott served as a nurse during the last tragic days of the war. Sick and wounded confederate soldiers were brought to her home for treatment.

The soldier who today is known only by company and regiment was brought from the battlefield and nursed by Miss Pogott. He died from his wounds and Miss Pogott had him buried in the family plot.

Legend had it that Miss Pogott lost her lover during the Battle of Gettysburg and in the young wounded soldier found surcease for the loss of her own sweetheart. For that reason she left his grave unnamed as a remembrance of the one the fortunes of war took from her.

Less than a cannon's shot away rests a group of unknown union soldiers who were buried in a Quaker graveyard.

They died from wounds during the invasion and capture of
