THINGS TO DO AFTER FORTY

The first thing to do after forty in the past each sound tooth forty, if like most Yankee Wise- acers, you have neglected proper care of your teeth in your preoccupation with trick brushes and glorified soap, is to have your teeth put in the best possible working order. This involves making a dental appointment and installing whatever dentures may be necessary or practical to replace missing teeth.

It has cost me many a new reader to say this. Moreover it is not in line with the character assigned to me by some of the throw-away "magazines" that tell the second rate dentists what to think of me and my column. In Seven Keys to Vite (for copy send twenty-five cents and a stamped self-addressed envelope) you will find Save Your Teeth is number 1 key.

It should be obvious to even the dumbest dentist, that I place a high value on teeth, either natural teeth or artificial teeth, that function well, and that I have great respect for good dentistry. 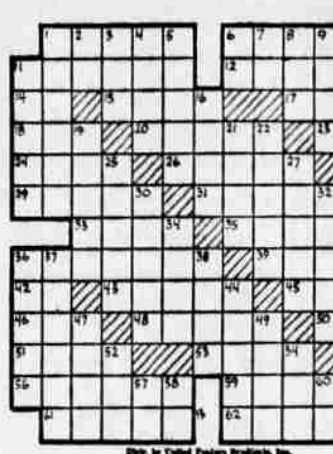

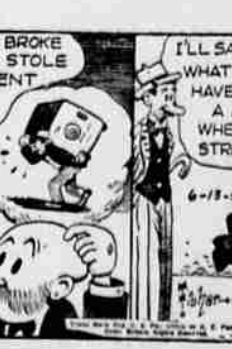
