Billion Dollar Club Still Has 56 Members

New York, June 13—(U.P.)—The exclusive Billion Dollar club of American enterprises still has 56 members but the club's assets have increased to an all-time peak of more than \$135 billion, a survey by the United Press revealed today.

Dissolution of Commonwealth & Southern removed that corporation from the list of companies with assets exceeding \$1 billion. But its place was taken by New England Mutual Life Insurance company.

Through another fatality to the Public Utility Holding Company act, American Power & Light still was in the billion-dollar class as of December 31, 1949. However, a plan for its dissolution went into effect early this year.

Total holdings of the billion dollar corporations increased five per cent in 1949 to \$135.

Bill Endorsed to Make Bradley Five-Star General

Washington, June 13—(U.P.)—Defense Secretary Louis Johnson has endorsed legislation to give Gen. Omar N. Bradley, chairman of the joint chiefs of staff, the five-star rank of General of the Army.

If approved by congress, it would be the first five-star rank created since World War II when four generals and four admirals were given that rank permanently.

In a letter to Chairman Carl Vinson, (D., Ga.) of the house armed services committee, Johnson wrote:

Entitled to Honor

"In my opinion, nothing that any of us can do to honor Gen. Bradley can exceed the honors to which he is entitled for his outstanding contributions to the security of this nation."

The bill is sponsored by Rep. Paul Shafer, (R., Mich.). No hearings have been scheduled.

One argument advanced for giving Bradley another star is to put him on par with Gen. Douglas MacArthur, supreme allied far eastern commander, the only five-star general on active duty.

Admiral Chester W. Nimitz, Ernest J. King and William Leahy are the other five-star officers listed as being on active duty. Nimitz is assigned to the United Nations and King and Leahy are ill.

TORNADOES DAMAGE TOWN

Alice, N.D., June 13—(U.P.)—This community of about 200 persons suffered about \$50,000 damage when twin tornadoes ripped through the town yesterday. No casualties were reported. Several small buildings were destroyed.

New York—(U.P.)—If Max Lovell has his way, life will be a continual pajama party.

Lovell came to the conclusion that the pajama has progressed from simply a sleeping attire to the fashionable thing after a nationwide survey on the subject. Women, who buy almost all the men's pajamas sold, are responsible for this newest trend, he said. Of those interviewed, 84.6 per cent thought it was a good idea.

"Gone are the days when pajamas were used in the bedroom alone," he said. "There's nothing objectionable about this, there's no rule that says you must wear heavy outer garments at home."

The idea, Lovell said, is to be as cool and as comfortable as possible.

Pointing out that women entertained at cocktail parties and dinners in hostess pajamas, Lovell said "this comfort should be extended to men."

Lovell is a humorist and a thought of people sleeping raw. It's uncomfortable, immodest and unhealthful, he said.

"Doctors will tell you that you should wear a garment while asleep," he said. "Most summer colds are due to sleeping without pajamas."
