Convention Set For Girls' State; McCall Speaker

Salem, Ore., June 14—(U.P.)—The 190 girls from all over Oregon participating in the six-day-long girls' state today will go through convention and campaign day.

The girls, divided into nationalist and federalist parties, will hold separate nominating conventions and then wage a campaign for votes.

Finances Chief Problem
Last night Lawson McCall, administrative assistant to Gov. Douglas McKay, told the girls that adequate finances are the chief problem at all government levels in Oregon.

McCall told the girls taking part in the eighth annual program on the Willamette university campus that there was a great need for finding methods to cut down sharp winter unemployment, to insure orderly handling of natural resources, to expand Oregon's schools and colleges and to provide proper supervision of the state's custodial cases.

Must Study Facts
He pointed out several facts the delegates should be aware of in their search for new revenues for the state. They included the ability of the taxpayer to pay, the possible adverse effects of a state property levy on local taxing bodies' revenues, and the fact that oppressive taxes tend "to drive away the industry that is needed to provide jobs in Oregon's expanding economy."

Purpose of the girls' state is to teach young women the responsibilities in American citizenship and good government.

Oregon State 4-H Summer School Opens

Corvallis, Ore., June 14—(U.P.)—The 35th annual Oregon State 4-H summer school opened here last night with an assembly in Oregon State college's Gill coliseum.

An estimated 1800 attended the first meeting of the 10-day session that ends June 23.

Members from all of Oregon's 36 counties will attend the school, receiving instruction from the OSC faculty, representatives of commercial firms and other professional experts.

Classes will be conducted in OSC classrooms and laboratories. The 4-H members are being housed in dormitories, fraternities and sororities.

Precedent in Dealing With Sex Offender

Salem, Ore., June 14—(U.P.)—Judge Joseph B. Felton has set a local precedent in dealing with a convicted sex offender, and it prevented the involved 10-year-old girl from appearing against the man before the grand jury in circuit court.

According to details of the case released today, the man was fined \$250 plus court costs and given a six-months suspended jail sentence for indecent exposure.

Jail sentence was suspended on the basis of the man's carrying out seven conditions. The principal condition stipulated that the 30-year-old veteran must receive psychiatric treatment, with the doctor and the man reporting to Judge Felton periodically.

Purpose of the probation is to rehabilitate a first offender with the goal of preventing a repeat or more serious sex offense in the future.

Crooked Creek Dragged For Body of Youth, 7

Prineville, Ore., June 14—(U.P.)—State police and volunteer firemen planned to continue dragging Crooked creek near here today for the body of seven-year-old Bobby Braxton, believed drowned yesterday.

The boy, son of Mr. and Mrs. W. T. Braxton, Prineville, was wading along the edge of the stream when the swift current swept him off his feet. Six playmates saw him disappear into the swollen creek.
