First Steps in Organization of Navy Unit Planned

First steps in activating the new naval reserve organized electronics company will be taken Monday when the unit will meet at the Federal building, 33 North Riverside avenue, at 7:30 p.m.

Directions for forming the company will be given by Lt. Ted Pierce, naval reserve procurement officer of the 13th naval district headquarters at Seattle. He will answer questions relative to the program and present administrative forms necessary to activate the group.

Further information about the proposed summer week-end cruises out of Crescent City will be given at the meeting, Lt. Fisher said. Members of the electronics company, the Seabee unit, and the volunteer composite group will be eligible to participate.

Urges Attendance
Officers urged that former members of the volunteer electronic warfare unit and those who have attended organizational meetings during the past month report at the Monday meeting so that preliminary paper work can be completed. He says that many of the billets in the radio, radar, sonar, and electronic technician branches have already been filled, but former rated navy men who can qualify for assignment may apply.

Openings still remain for former unrated men and non-service personnel over the age of 17 years. Complete training courses will be set up under competent instructors to permit these men to strike for ratings. Pay will be granted for the drill periods and complete uniforms issued.

It is expected that the Medford company will be the first in the Pacific northwest to be activated under the new organizational plan.
