

Shakespeare Play
Try-Outs Slated
All Day Monday

Ashland, June 17—Try-outs for the 10th annual Shakespearean festival here will be held all day Monday, starting at 9 a.m., according to Gene Malecki, Salem, public relations representative for the festival.

A large number of people from all sections of the country will try out for parts, Malecki said, and many of them have arrived in Ashland already to be on hand for the occasion. Among those who have indicated they would try out are persons from New York (the farthest distant point represented), California, Washington, Illinois, Wisconsin and Michigan.

Some reservations for seats at the festival have already been received, Malecki said, the earliest date they have ever been sent in. Five national magazines—Quick, Life, Opera, Sunset and Theater Arts—have indicated they will have coverage of the festival, and others have shown an interest, Malecki said.
