## Hoover Asks Boost In FBI Manpower

Washington, June 21.—(U.P.)—FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover told congress today that he needs more manpower to combat increasingly tricky subversives and prevent a security "breakdown."

But he warned against "suppression and outlawing." In the FBI section of the justice department's annual report to the house and senate, Hoover said:

"The increasing stealth and deceit employed by subversives make the work of the FBI increasingly difficult and require more manpower and ingenuity to secure the information which will prevent a breakdown of our domestic security."

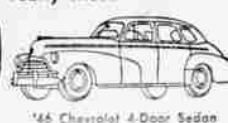
