

Ten B-36 Crews Await Orders for What May Be Epoch-Making Flight

Fairfield-Suisun Air Base, Cal. June 21—(UPI)—Ten B-36 bombers and their crews awaited orders today to take off on what some observers believed might be an epoch-making trans-Pacific flight.

The airplanes were gassed up and ready to go on what the air force officially described as an "operational practice flight."

Pretty Good Guess

An air force spokesman said the destination would not be known even to the air crews until final orders are received from the strategic air command in Washington. But, he added, it might be a "pretty good guess" that the flight would include "a

long overwater hop."

This gave rise to speculation that the big bombers might attempt a flight to the Orient, perhaps even as far as Japan, where Defense Secretary Louis Johnson, Gen. Omar N. Bradley, chairman of the joint chiefs of staff and other high-ranking defense officials are visiting.

Long Hops Not New

Observers said the B-36s are known to have traveled a similar distance non-stop—from Texas to Alaska and return. Last year a flight traveled from Texas to Honolulu and returned without being picked up by radar in the islands.

The spokesman said it was not known whether the airplanes would fly singly or in a group.

The B-36s arrived here Monday after a seven-hour flight from their home base in Carswell, Tex., where they make up part of the 7th heavy bombardment wing.

Progress, Growth Of SOC Revealed In Two Reports

Ashland, June 21—Growth of Southern Oregon college was indicated in two separate news items reported here yesterday.

Mrs. Mabel Winston, registrar, said that enrollment figures for the summer session here show a first-day increase of 30 per cent over last summer's. And Dr. Elmo N. Stevenson, president, reported that the state board of higher education has approved a million dollar expansion program for the college, involving construction of six new buildings.

Monday's registration for summer courses was 369, compared with 280 the same day last year. Registration will continue until next Monday. Some 500 students are expected before registration closes, Mrs. Winston said.

New Buildings Planned

In the construction program, Dr. Stevenson said that a quarter-million dollars are earmarked for a physical education plant at Fuller field, including both men's and women's gymnasium facilities. A similar sum will go for a central heating plant and about \$200,000 for a new men's dormitory.

Also scheduled for construction during the 1952-53 biennium are a \$250,000 science building, a \$250,000 music-arts unit and rehabilitation of Churchill hall and Memorial court. Under the plans the present gymnasium would be converted to a student union building and would include a little theater, lounges and facilities for other campus activities.

Bing Crosby Arrives At Hollywood Home

The singer arrived home yesterday from a bachelor's sojourn in Europe. He got off a train at a substation to avoid newsmen.

While Crosby was in Paris rumors popped up that he and his wife of 20 years were separating. Both he and Dixie denied the story.

She didn't meet him when he arrived but was waiting for him when he got home.
