'Southern Oregon Day' To Start Gold Rush Jubilee in Jacksonville This Year

Jacksonville, June 22.—August 5, first day of the Jacksonville Gold Rush Jubilee, is to be Southern Oregon day, according to P. E. "Scotty" Matheny, general chairman of the third annual Jacksonville Lions club sponsored event. The two-day celebration this year will be Saturday and Sunday, August 5 and 6.

Main event of the Southern Oregon day program will be the dedication of the old county court house in Jacksonville as the Southern Oregon Historical society museum, according to Matheny.

To Make Plans

The general chairman also announced that a general meeting will be held at 8 p.m. today in the U. S. hotel for the purpose of making plans for Southern Oregon day. The meeting he stated is to be attended by representatives of city governments from throughout Southern Oregon, Jackson county court and sheriff's office; Grants Pass, Ashland and Medford clubs and merchants, as well as the county chamber of commerce and Jacksonville lodges and civic groups.

The meeting is open to the public and anyone interested in the museum or jubilee is invited, Matheny stated.

The spokesman added "we will need help of all of Southern Oregon to make the day a success. We not only consider it an outstanding tourist attraction but a 'red letter' day for all of us home folks."

Heading the executive committee for the Jacksonville Lions club, with Matheny, are E. E. McIntyre, O. W. Matheny, A. C. Van Galder, and Ben Anderson.

Final plans for the jubilee were begun at a meeting of the executive group Tuesday evening.

Drawings Decide Tie Election Count

Salem, Ore., June 22.—(U.P.)—Two candidates for public office in the May 19 primary election have been decided by a drawing after final election results showed there had been a tie vote with their opponents, the state bureau of elections today said it had been informed.

In Malheur county, Vernon Wilson got the same number of write-in votes as Ernest Metcalf for democratic candidate. He also was a republican candidate. No one filed for the democratic nomination, but Wilson won over Metcalf in the drawing.

In Morrow county, the district attorney race ended in a dead heat, and Phil Mahoney was picked as democratic nominee over Bradley Fancher, a republican nominee.

However, Mahoney has publicly stated that he does not want the nomination. Under state law Mahoney must file a notice of withdrawal from the candidacy if he does not want the nomination. State laws make a drawing mandatory in cases of tie votes.
