Only .001 of a percentage point separates the Rogues from the third-place Pittsburgh Diamonds this morning.

LaVerre Herrmann did the hurling chores in the curtain-raiser last night with a three-hit pitching masterpiece. The Rogues made all three of their runs in the first inning on walks to Don Williams and Bob Haddock, Jack Cooney's single and Chuck Freeman's double.

Seventh Victory
The Central Point youth didn't walk a man and the only balls to go out of the infield by Marysville were the hits made by the Californians. It was Herrmann's seventh victory against nine losses this season.

Mike Kanshin, the former Western International league hurler, got credit for the victory in the second game of the twin bill as he came to relieve Bill Francis in the second inning and allowed but two hits and no runs.

Ashland, June 26—Myrtle Creek whipped Ashland 13 to 3 yesterday in a Southern Oregon league baseball game at Myrtle Creek.

15-Man Track Team Leaves for Finland

College Park, Md., June 26 (U.P.)—A 15-man track and field team, headed by Hurler Dick Atlessey of the Los Angeles A. C., was scheduled to leave for Finland today on the first of five

foreign tours which the National AAU will sponsor this year.

Atlessey, a University of Southern California star running for the Los Angeles A. C., really earned his plane ride. The 6-foot, 4-inch senior smashed a world record for the second time this season Saturday when he won the 110 meter high hurdles in 13.6 seconds at the National AAU outdoor championships.

Earlier this year, he set a new world standard of 13.5 for the 120 yard high hurdles.

All except four of the new national champions were among the 50 men selected for the foreign trips. George Rhoden of Morgan State retained the 400-meter title but was left out because he is from Jamaica, B.W.I., and not a U. S. citizen. Broad Jump Winner Jim Holland of Northwestern couldn't go; and Frank Berst, weight champion from the New York A. C., and Champion Walker Henry Laskau of the Maccabi A. C. won events which didn't appeal to the invitation committees in the countries to be visited.
