

Rogues Lose to Peaches in 11th; Return Here Against Reno July 4

Medford Rogues baseball squad left this morning for Willows, Cal., where the local Far West league club opens a three-game series tonight followed by four tilts at Marysville starting on Friday. They return to Medford July 4 to play Reno, Nev.

Medford's Rogues and the Marysville Peaches made two trades in their four-game series concluded last night at the fairgrounds but it is questionable whether the local fans were too pleased over either trade.

Last night it took 11 innings for the Californians to defeat the Rogues and thus even the series at two victories a piece but another trade was made when it was an unearned run that tied the score for Medford in the ninth and another gave Marysville a win.

Late Game Rally

The Rogues had displayed some of their earlier late game rallies when they pushed over that tying run in the ninth inning with two out.

After Russ Stuart had struck out, the Marysville second baseman kicked around Jack Cooney's grounder for an error. Johnny Popovich also struck out but Don Williams drew a walk after pushing the count to three and two.

With Cooney on second base Bob Haddock sent a ground single just out of the reach of the Peaches' third baseman and Cooney ambled home easily for the tying run.

First Batter Fans

The 11th inning for Marysville started out about the same way with Cummins falling for Veteran Pete Jones' curve balls for a strike out but Olson lashed a grounder that struck the first base sack and bounded over Cooney's head for a hit.

Cruger was hit by a pitched ball and Santo grounded to Lloyd Jones at second base for Medford who tossed to Stuart for the force play at second but when the local shortstop tried for the double play at first the ball got by Cooney and Olson scored.

Jonas obviously was tiring in the last inning or two after relieving starter Bob Smith in the sixth and allowing the Peaches but three hits and two runs.

Local Fielding Gems

Williams pulled down a beauty in deep right on an over-the-shoulder catch in the third inning. Chuck Freeman ran into deep right center near the fence for a back-to-the-field catch in the second and Stuart made a long throw from deep short for a nice play in the tenth for Medford.

Medford picked up two runs in the second stanza when Haddock and Freeman walked. Marc Guglielmo sacrificed. Jones and Smith drew walks. Haddock scored on a passed ball and Freeman tallied when Stuart's grounder took a bad hop to second base.

Two more in the seventh for the Rogues came in on a walk to Cooney Williams' triple and Haddock's single.
