where Judy grew up, said there
isn't an employee on the place
who isn't pulling for the girl
who tried to kill herself last
week.

"The executives out here are
telling everybody they suspended
her because she embarrassed
and inconvenienced them," one
young actress fumed. "They say
she lowers the morale."

"Well, let me tell you this:
I'm one of Judy's co-workers
and I know most of the others.
And we all think very highly
of her—both as a person and as
a trouper."

Another bit player said the
way they're treating Miss Gar-
land "gives me a pain."

"They won't leave her alone
until she drops dead," she mut-
tered.

Unfair, Too

A pretty young blonde, who
said she's "had bits" in most of
the Garland movies, thinks
MGM is "not only ungrateful
but unfair."

"Judy has always been a big
box-office draw," she said. "She

made millions for those guys at
the top. And they better not for-
get it."

Not only her co-workers but
her fans are rallying around the
big-eyed singing star who's still
resting from her near-tragic
suicide attempt.

Letters are pouring in by the
hundreds. Offers of high-paying
jobs are flooding in from theater
owners and radio stations from
as far away as London.

"Judy was always doing nice
things for little people," an ex-
tra at MGM explained. "She'd
lend you money if you needed it
—and then act embarrassed
when you came to pay it
back."

"If you were just down in the
dumps she'd knock herself out
to cheer you up. And sometimes
that's more valuable than
money."

DEFENDANTS DISMISSED

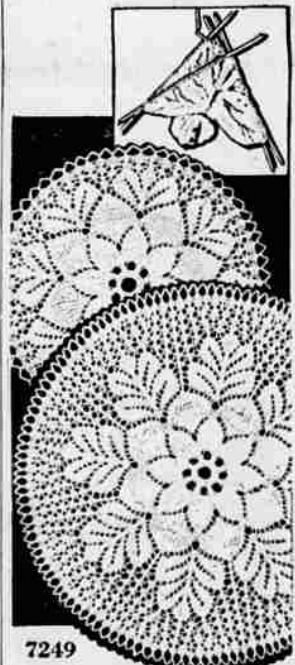
