

Corner of State Capitol Floating On Sheet of Water

Salem, Ore., June 29—(U.P.)—Secretary of State Earl T. Newbry disclosed today that the southwest corner of the state capitol building is "floating" on a sheet of water.

The water has cracked plaster in every basement room in that section of the building, Newbry said.

Newbry, whose duties include those of custodian of state buildings, expressed belief that the water is seepage from rains. He also said there was a possibility that some springs are located beneath the building.

To Request Survey
Newbry said he will ask the board of control to authorize a survey by an engineer to get estimates of cost of eliminating the water. Then he will present the problem to the 1951 legislature. Newbry is a member of the board of control. The other members are Gov. Douglas McKay and State Treasurer Walter J. Pearson.

Two grooves have been carved out of the cement in the engine room. Each is about four inches deep and 1½ inches wide. One is about three feet long and the other slightly shorter, Lawrence Christiansen, superintendent of the building, estimated a flow of 30,000 gallons of water a month through the long trench in the rainy season.

Water is seeping through the stone flooring in the basement in the southwest corner, and wa-

ter stains are evident. The south elevator shaft fills with water and at least once a month it is pumped out.

Newbry emphasized that there is no danger of the seepage causing any serious damage, such as collapse.

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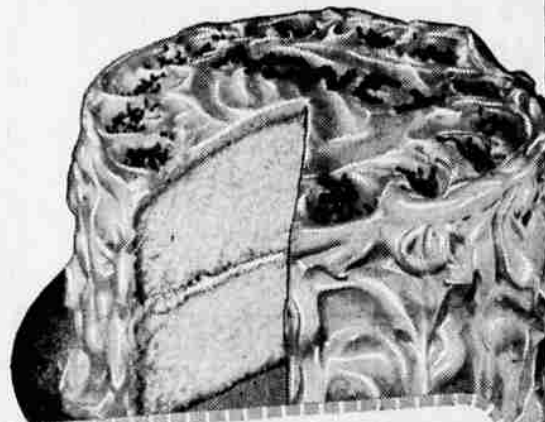
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HONEY CAKE

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Gift together into large bowl:
2½ cups sifted cake flour
3 teaspoons double-action baking powder (or 4 tps. single-action)
1 teaspoon salt
½ cup sugar

Add:
2 eggs
2 teaspoons grated orange rind
Be... 1 minute. Turn into 2 greased 8" layer pans, lined with plain paper. Bake in a moderate oven (350° F.) about 30 minutes. Frost with—

HONEY FROSTING: Combine 2 egg whites, 1 cup brown sugar, ½ teaspoon cream of tartar, ½ cup honey in top of double boiler. Place over boiling water. Beat constantly with a rotary beater until icing stands in peaks... about 7 minutes. Frost cake. Decorate top with chocolate sprinkles.

Mix enough to dampen flour. Beat 2 minutes. If by hand, count beating time only; with electric mixer, use "low speed." Scrape bowl often; scrape beaters after 2 minutes.

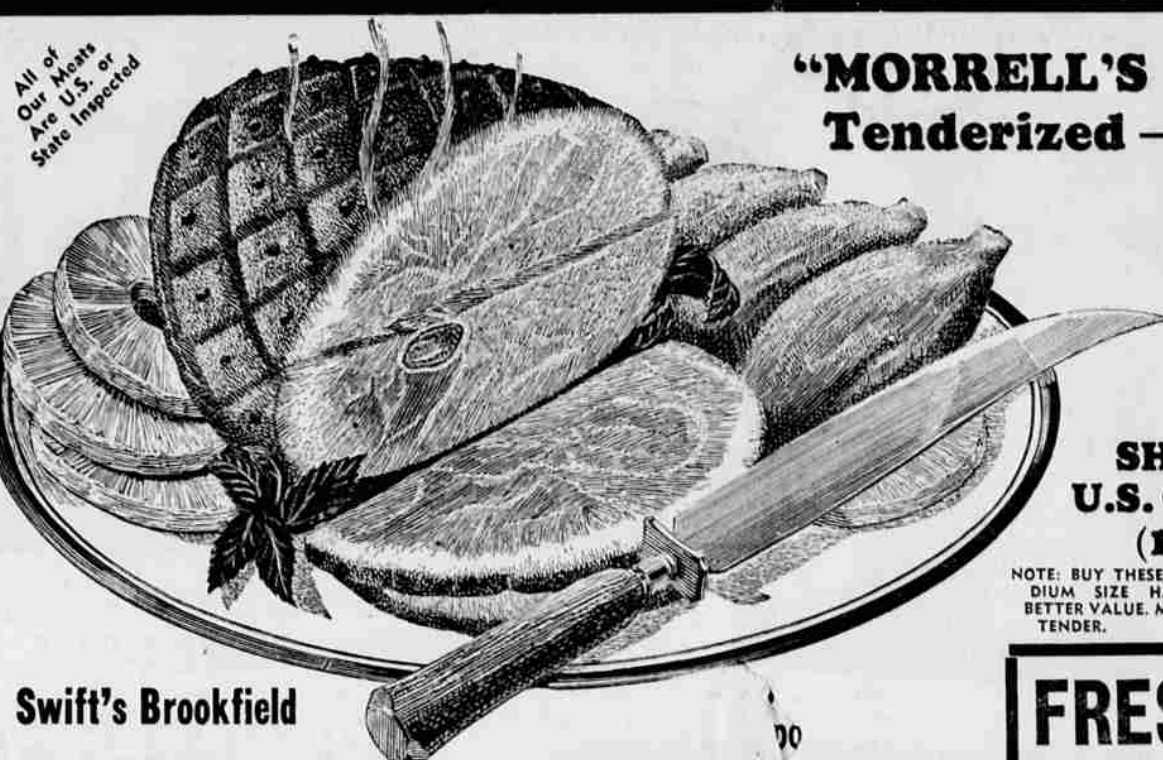
