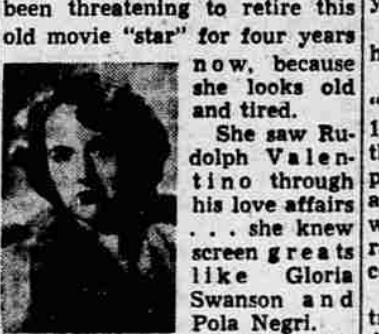

CHRONIC ACETANILID POISONING

Acetanilid poisoning occurs more frequently than barbiturate (goof balls, sleeping tablets) poisoning but in most cases the nature of the poison is masked under some vague name such as "headache," "cold," "neuralgia" or "stomach" remedy, and in fatal cases the cause of death is perhaps certified, by some doctor who wants to save the family unpleasant publicity, as "heart failure" or the equivalent in medical lingo.

Man about 55 came home after his game of golf in his usual good health and spirits. Toward dinner time he had a touch of what he called "indigestion"--as though arrest or slowing of the digestive process could account for pain or distress--and, being a regular Yankee Wiseacre he resorted to a dose of a nostrum that contains a large quality of acetanilid--it is in fact merely a disguised form of the drug for indiscriminate sale to the sucker population. One dose brought no relief, so the wiseacre repeated the dose, and kept on repeating it well into the evening. About midnight his wife heard odd sounds, found him livid and could not awaken him. By the time a doctor in the neighborhood arrived the man was dead. Acetanilid poisoning, of course, but an old medical friend of the family fixed up the death certificate so that a mysterious "heart" failure took care

of everything. The striking features of acetanilid poisoning are (1) cyanosis--blueness of lips, nails and the entire body surface, and (2) heart failure with collapse.

The d.f. who takes a dose or several doses of the poison, under an innocent proprietary name, for "cold" (whatever that may prove to be), headache, sense of fatigue, neuralgia or "indigestion" generally suffers from progressive decrease in red corpuscles for a year or two before complete breakdown.

Acetanilid benumbs or dulls normal sensibility to pain, ache, fatigue, anxiety or other distress, but it is not a remedy or cure for anything, despite what the nostrum mongers tell prospective customers.

Besides the immediate untoward effects of acetanilid there are many cases of acetanilid habit--victims who take it in one form or another several times a day and are unwilling to bear temporarily the headache, insomnia, restlessness or irritability involved in breaking the habit. Since acetanilid diminishes the oxygen carrying capacity of the blood habitual users show progressive degeneration of vital organs, notably the heart and the central nervous system.

There is no specific remedy for these untoward effects of acetanilid--no direct antidote. Of course treatment in any instance begins with immediate and absolute withdrawal of the drug.
