## Yank Bagpipers To Sport Stewart Plaids on Kilts

With The U. S. 2nd Division, Korea—(U.P.)—U. S. 2nd Infantry Division band bagpipe players said Wednesday they will wear royal Stewart plaid on their bagpipes and kilts—and dared the British to do something about it. The bagpipe players ordered kilts of the Stewart tartan from Scotland to match the plaid on 10 bagpipes in the section, which were purchased from a Glasgow manufacturer.

**Bandmen Worried**

At first the bandmen were worried when told they had appropriated a privilege—that of wearing the royal Stewart tartan—which had taken the king's own Scottish borders of the Commonwealth Division in Korea 250 years to earn by gallant soldiering.

Lt. William R. Gasbarro of Columbus, O., the band's commander, said the band was entitled to wear the plaid. "We are going right ahead and wear the stuff because we've just found out we have a beginner in the bagpipe section who has royal blood in his veins," Gasbarro said.

**Genealogy Traced**

The man "with royal blood in his veins" was David C. Anderson, 22, Venice, Calif., who began playing one of the band's bagpipes only two weeks ago. "My aunt was very interested in genealogy, and she figured out that our family dates back to the royal Scottish line," said Anderson. "She says we are related to that guy Clive of India, too."

## No Fine Print Noted On 127-Year-Old IOU

Carbondale, Ill.—(U.P.)—Mrs. Grace Swafford Wykes, Benton, Ill., didn't expect to collect on the 127-year-old IOU she held, so she passed it on to the Southern Illinois university museum here.

The faded document bears the promise of William Sullivan to repay \$10 he borrowed from Mrs. Wykes' great-grandfather, Shadrock Mooneyham, in 1824.

John W. Allen, museum curator, said "people certainly were honest in those days." Sullivan used his personal seal—the equivalent of a notary public's seal today, and all the facts are stated plainly—"no fine print."

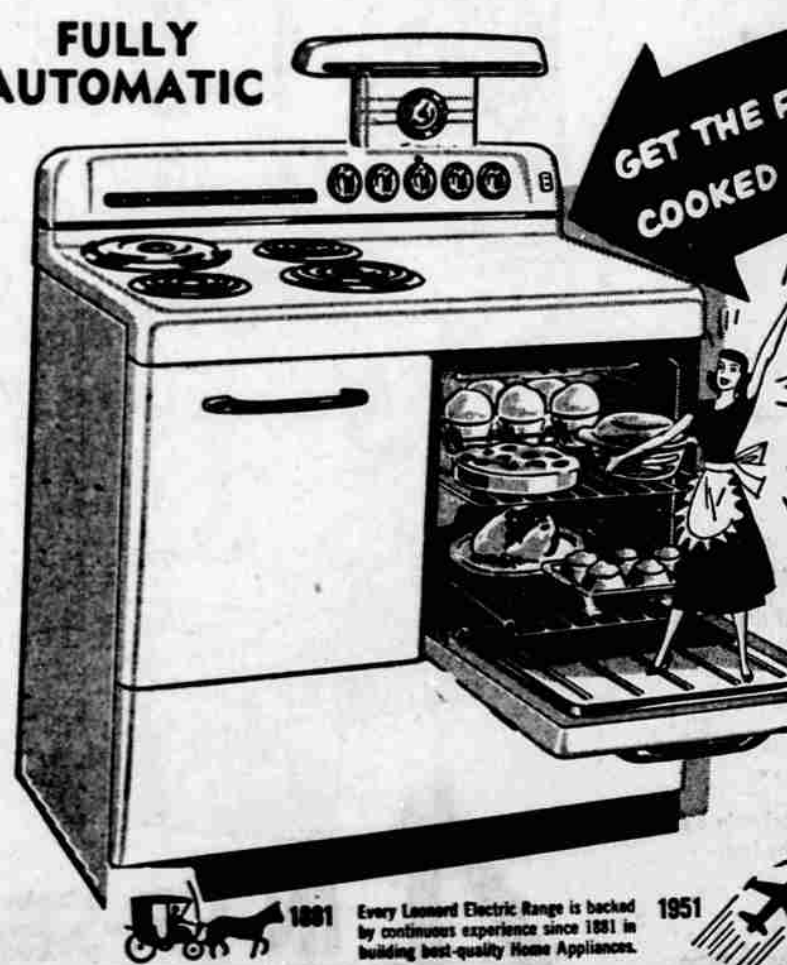
