Philadelphia Hotel Burns; 150 Evacuated

Philadelphia — (U.P.) — More than 150 persons were evacuated safely Friday when a seven-alarm fire, largest in the city in three years, destroyed the seven-story Clinton hotel in downtown Philadelphia and damaged three adjoining four-floor apartment houses.

More than a dozen hotel guests, trapped on upper floors by heavy smoke, were rescued down aerial ladders by firemen. Some of them had to be talked out of leaping from upper windows. Several of the hotel guests were treated for hysteria at nearby hospitals.

The million dollar blaze, which began in a linen closet, continued out of control five hours after it first was discovered.

WHO KNOWS ANYTHING ABOUT PYORRHEA?

I believe I know as much about the condition commonly called pyorrhea as—oh, well, I can afford to be modest about it and say I know as much as the average physician or dentist does about it. That isn't much.

In the first place the very name pyorrhea, which means flow or discharge of pus, has no specific significance. It sounds more imposing to say pyorrhea alveolaris, which means flow of pus from tooth sockets. If there is little or no evidence of suppuration (pus formation) some dentists use another term, such as gingivitis, which means inflammation of the gum, and still doesn't identify any specific disease.

Many dentists or dental authorities have set forth their views of the cause, nature, prevention and treatment of so-called pyorrhea, each his own, like the numerous techniques for brushing the teeth, leading us a little farther into the woods and leaving us no better off than we were before.

It seems that patients who seek treatment for pyorrhea must continue treatment from

now on. If a dentist or a periodontist had the temerity to dismiss a pyorrhea patient as cured his or her colleagues would raise their eyebrows and question the accuracy of the diagnosis.

I hate to mention it so abruptly, but I believe all of the mouth conditions usually ascribed to pyorrhea are manifestations of physical deficiencies in prenatal life, infancy, childhood and youth.

The degeneration process was regarded in the past as atrophy (wasting, shrinkage) of gums, teeth, jaw bone.

The process may be retarded or arrested even in mature individuals by correcting the nutritional deficiencies not for weeks or months but from now on.

If any physician of standing questions this I'll be glad to cite the source. If your daughter requires any treatment for infected tonsils let it be electro-coagulation (diathermy).

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More Metal Expected For Civilian Industry

Washington — (U.P.) — The supply of metals for civilian goods may be increased in April after being cut back steadily for the past year, it was learned Friday.

A National Production Authority official expressed the "cautious hope" that manufacturers of consumer goods will get a larger allotment of scarce metals during the second quarter of the year than in the first.

He said there has been an "easing" of the tight supply situation in aluminum and steel in recent weeks.

No firm decisions have yet been made about relief for civilian industry. Officials first want to make sure that they can meet all essential demands without drawing any more metals from the nation's emergency stockpile.

Enemy Casualties Estimated 1,635,000

Washington — (U.P.) — The Defense Department Friday estimated enemy casualties in Korea at 1,635,000 through February 19. This was an increase of about 20,000 over the last report covering the war through February 6.

The new estimate included about 1,148,000 battle casualties, 317,000 non-battle casualties and 170,000 captured.
