

1951 Wages Paid Oregon Employees History's Highest

Salem—(U.P.)—Wages paid to an average of some 335,000 employees of 18,000 Oregon firms in 1951 are believed to have totaled more than \$1,200,000,000 or at least \$140 million more than ever before.

The State Unemployment Compensation commission made the estimate Friday on the basis of completed tabulations of employers' reports for the first nine months of last year.

Record pay rolls in construction, lumber and food processing, all of which increased considerably more than the average over previous years in 1950, were mainly responsible for the new marks. By area, Curry, Umatilla, Crook, Lane, Coos, Hood River, Tillamook, Douglas, Jackson and Wasco counties led the way with gains for the first three quarters of more than 20 per cent.

The building has 10 rooms which include two operating rooms, a research and development room, prosthetic laboratory, x-ray room, consultation office and utility room.

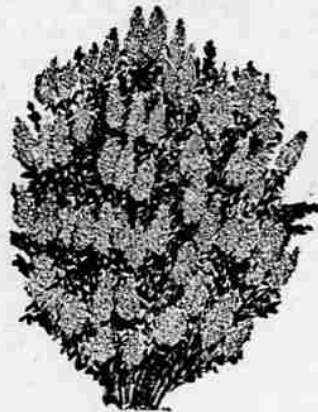

During the war Dr. Kubalek served as navy dental officer and was discharged a lieutenant commander. He served with the 4th Marine air wing in the Marshall and Mariana islands as recruit training dental officer at Great Lakes, at the Naval air station at Kodiak, Alaska, and attended classes in surgery and prosthetic dentistry at Bethesda, Md.

Returning to civilian life, he did research work in dental materials at Northwestern university. He came west to begin private practice and after looking for locations throughout Oregon, the family decided on Medford.
