TWINS BECOME PARENTS

We have four daughters in our family, two of whom are twins, and each of the twins has borne children, one of them has twin boys.

Twins sister married brothers (not twins); the one twin sister had 14 children, the other 15. Who says one of twin sisters is always sterile? (Mrs. G. S.)

My twin sister and I are 51, the oldest of a family of seven children, three boys, four girls. My sister has borne four sons. I have borne three boys and four girls (Mrs. A. M. K.)

There have been twins, sometimes two, as far back as my mother's family history runs, in every generation till now. My grandmother had two sets of girl twins. Three of these girls married and bore five, two and eight children respectively—my mother is the one who bore eight, including a pair of twin girls. LOVING TWO MEN IS PLAYING WITH FIRE

All week long, I tell myself I won't go out with him but when he comes home for the week-ends, I can't help it. I know I love my husband but how can I love his brother too? I want to tell my husband about it but I don't want to hurt him as he loves me very much. I don't know if his brother loves me but I think he is beginning to by the things he is saying the last time I was with him. What shall I do?"—R. D.

A. Stop seeing your husband's brother except at family gatherings. That will put an end to any budding romance that may be springing up between the two of you. You are the one who must control the situation as you are the one who is falling in love first.

Are you sure that this is real love and not just a case of loving someone because he is so much like your husband? It sounds to me as if you have found your brother-in-law so much like your husband in his attitudes, actions, and perhaps even in his looks that you are transferring your love for your husband to his brother.

Naturally you are lonely while your husband is away and it is fun to go out occasionally with someone who knows your husband so well that you can talk about him. But, it should be no more than a family friendship. If it goes beyond that, it should come to an immediate end.

Under no considerations should you tell your husband about your feelings for his brother until he returns home

from the service. In the first place, think how upsetting it would be to him to think that his brother was stealing his wife's affections while he was away, serving his country, and could not come home to straighten things out.

Might Cause Rift Then, too, you are not even sure that his brother really cares for you other than as a member of the family. If you told your husband that his brother was in love with you, it might cause a rift in the family that would never be healed.

And, finally, it is very likely that you would kill some of your husband's love for you if you told him you had fallen in love with someone else while he was away from home. You are not even sure that you love this man. It may just be a case of loneliness and transfer of affection. So, to avoid being burned, stop playing with fire and play a safe game until your husband returns.

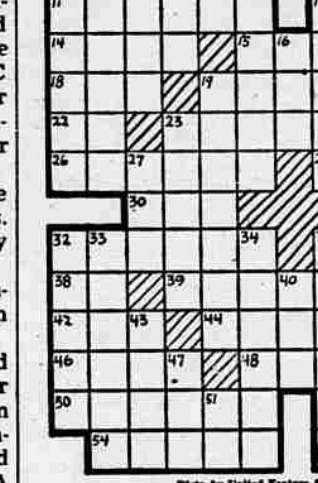
