WILL AN OUTSIDER UPSET A MARRIAGE?

Modern men and women are concerned about the in-law problem because so much has been written and said about it lately. When an in-law lives with the family, does it necessarily always mean trouble? That is what is concerning the young woman who wrote the following letter:

O. "I am planning to be married in the near future. My fiancé loves my daughter by a former marriage and he says his brother can continue to live there after we are married. I am very much against this because the presence of any third party just won't work out. I know that a third party always interferes."—T. B. L.

A. I am sorry to say I disagree with your statement that a "third party always interferes". It is true that a third party does, sometimes, interfere, but then you may have interference from relatives or friends who do not live in your home.

A woman in the home is much more likely to be the source of trouble and friction than a man. Too often women have the habit of trying to boss other people and this causes trouble.

A single man, by contrast, is not likely to spend enough time at home to do more than eat, sleep, and dress. If he takes his meals with you, it will only be breakfast and dinner. Then he will be out of the house the rest of the time, either at work or dating.

If he pays you and your new husband for his board and lodging, as he doubtless will, I can guarantee that it will be the easiest money you have ever earned. Your brother-in-law won't want any waiting on and he will be satisfied with any food you put before him.

Record Sums Allotted To 31 Oregon Counties

Salem.—(U.P.)—The largest allocation of federal funds ever made to Oregon was distributed Wednesday by Secretary of State Earl T. Newbry to 31 of Oregon's 36 counties.

The money represents 25 per cent of the receipts from timber sales and rentals on federal forest lands for the year ending last June and totals \$4,292,056. It is paid to the counties in lieu of taxes.

Seventy-five per cent of the money goes into county road funds, and the rest into school funds.

Amounts received by counties included: Jackson, \$126,765.63; Josephine, \$99,643.50.

WISDOM OF CHOOSING DRAFTY CORNER

Surveys made by medical officers of the U. S. Public Health Service in various urban and rural parts of the country at various times in the year showed that three-fourths of the illness, medical and surgical, attended by physicians, is directly or indirectly due to respiratory infection.

The prevention of respiratory infection therefore is or should be the paramount purpose of all public health administration and personal health care.

It is conceivable that under exceptional conditions certain respiratory infections may be airborne in the sense that the germ or virus floats about or is carried by the air from the first person who develops the disease to other persons in the neighborhood or community—or even to persons miles away.

But at the same time it is notable that nearly all the classical examples of such air-borne infection are historical, legendary or hypothetical. Yellow fever was in that category prior to the discovery that the infection is conveyed only through the bite of the breed of mosquito known as *Aedes aegypti* or *Stegomyia fasciata*. The ordinary everyday mode or way of respiratory infection is droplet or spray infection. The germ or virus of the disease is carried from nose or throat in the droplets of moisture or secretions given off in the spray that shoots forth from nose and/or mouth when one coughs, sneezes, sings, shouts, talks or laughs.

Some of the droplets are visible, but most of them are too small to be visible to the naked eye, although not too small to contain virus or germs. Some of the droplets are palpable, unpleasantly so if you have ever been caught in the spray, but most of them are impalpably fine, though still moist enough to keep virus or germ alive until it lands on fertile ground and

sets about incubating a new case.

Most people today have heard about the hazard of sneeze and cough spray and some of them even try to mask or cover their coughs and sneezes when in the company of other persons. But health authorities and physicians are squeamish about spray infection—or ignorant or both—and therefore they never mention conversation spray when advising people to cough and sneeze. But I hope I may be permitted to tell you poor so-and-so's, particularly you high school and college graduates whose education has been so sadly neglected, that it is by the spray of polite conversation that you catch what ails you—spray not from across a crowded room but from across the counter, desk, dinner table, ticket window, theater seat, bridge table, hair dresser's or manicure's stand. Sneeze or cough spray has a range of ten or twelve feet; conversation spray a range of two to five feet.

Beyond these distances infection is virtually impossible, for the simple reason that virus or germ will not survive either drying or the reduction of temperature if the droplet to be the air for more than a second. But within range (2 to 5 feet) a suitable mask is as essential for safety in the shoe store or at

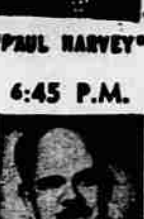
