

Baruch Says HST Knew of Donations To 1940 Campaign

New York—(U.P.)—Bernard Baruch tossed back to the winter White House Thursday his answer to denials that the President was unaware of his contributions to Mr. Truman's 1940 Missouri senatorial campaign.

The elder statesman said Wednesday night that Mr. Truman not only knew about the contributions but "very graciously thanked me in person."

"I very distinctly remember he came in once to see me when I was in Washington and thanked me graciously," Baruch said.

Mentioned in Article

The white-haired financier's part in Mr. Truman's successful campaign for a second Senate term 12 years ago was mentioned in a Saturday Evening Post article, "What You Don't Know About Truman," by Samuel Lubell, an associate of Baruch.

Lubell said Baruch "contributed generously" to the campaign.

Gov. James F. Byrnes of South Carolina said that Baruch made two large contributions to help Mr. Truman in his bid for reelection to the Senate.

Knowledge Denied

"Mr. Truman requested me to ask Mr. Baruch for assistance and I did so and Mr. Baruch contributed generously," Byrnes said. "Then a second time Mr. Truman made a similar request to me to ask Mr. Baruch for assistance. I again did so and Mr. Baruch again contributed."

When White House Press Secretary Joseph Short was asked for comment following publication of Lubell's article, he said Mr. Truman had no way of knowing who contributed to his campaign because the money was sent to the Missouri Democratic organization.

Comment On This and That

Washington — (U.P.) — This was right after the late war. A little American girl, whose daddy was German-born, was hiding out, trembling.

Out yonder was a cow. Some body else's cow. The little girl would sneak through the brush, kneel and pull the "cords." It

became a habit — the only way to get milk in Germany. But it was "skim" milk—even right from the cow. As Mary Ann Scherer told it to me, that was the only way a cow could give milk in Germany in those days.

"The cows had no more to eat than we did. So how could they produce any butterfat," she said simply.

Mary Ann, fattened up, pretty and 17, is back in America today—little the worse for eating potato peels and drinking skim milk. She told me her story over a glass of orange juice.

Taken to Homeland
Her daddy, John A. Scherer, was born in Germany. He came over here and had taken out only his first papers when he decided to take his family back to the homeland to visit the grandparents.

Mary Ann was a tot then and doesn't remember the boat ride. Then along came the war. The father was drafted into the German army.

The mother, an older brother, and Mary Ann were left in a town known as Windheimisch, which to Ann became known as the "Home of The Winds."

"We heard a lot of firing and we were sniped at and we were cold, but we didn't get hurt," she said. "The schools closed and my brother and I didn't learn much."

Took Ride for Food
During those days, Mary Ann said, the folks in the town used to ride atop a freight car 300 to 400 miles to get potato peels.

"We used to put them into a pot, along with some pepper, the blood from an animal, and make what we called 'blood

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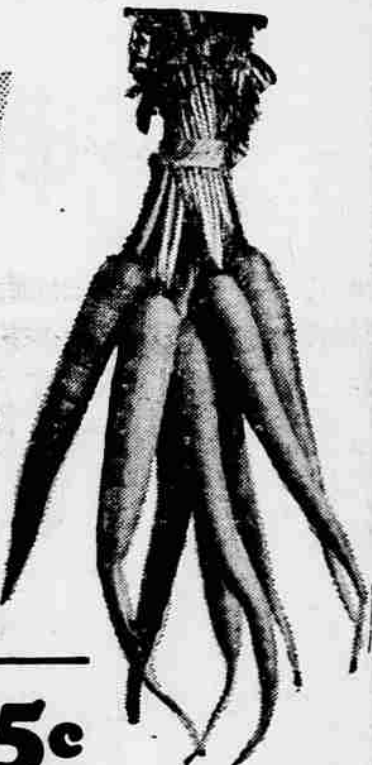
