Take the longshoremen's strike that tied up the entire N. Y. harbor that included a cargo ship of cobalt held up that is still felt in the defense setup. A recent magazine article told how it was a strike of union members against their leaders who were in cahoots with political gangsters who were allowed to run in favorites for the morning "showup" for work.

Why did not the newspapers report this at the time so that this nation's people could know where the fault lay? Now we have a paralyzing strike on the N. Y. Central. Are they communist led or do they have grievances so great that they can risk national censure, including that of our boys across the sea fighting for this very freedom that the railroad brotherhood is apparently flouting?

The vote our forebears fought and bled for is our strength when we know the facts. It is our weakness when the truth is not given us. Let us know why and just who is at fault in this frightening railway strike.

Republicans in News; Candidates Night Set

A "candidates' night" for Jackson county Republicans will be held at the Medford YMCA Thursday evening it was announced yesterday.

Under the joint sponsorship of the Jackson County Young Republicans and the Jackson County Republican Women, the meeting will be attended by a number of candidates for public office at the May 16 primary election.

Two other Republican candidates were in the news this week-end.

Fred Robinson, Medford, one of three Republican candidates for nomination as state treasurer, reported on the organization of his campaign throughout the state, and the father of Catherine Holtz, a Medford woman who is a candidate for election as an at-large delegate to the Republican national convention, issued information about her candidacy.

Candidates Coming
The Republican meeting Thursday will begin at 8 p. m. and several candidates from other sections of the state will be present to explain their qualifications for office, according to Bob Dickey, county Young GOP chairman. Mrs. Stephen Nye, county vice-chairman of the Republican Women's group and its program director, said that "most of the people in this part of the state do not have an opportunity to meet with candidates for state office from other areas. This type of program will assist in this difficulty."

Mrs. Nye and Dickey urged all county Republicans to attend, and stressed the fact that the multiple choices in a primary election face the voter with the responsibility of informing himself about candidates.

Refreshments will be served during the meeting.

Committees Organized
Robinson, a brief one-time candidate for nomination as U. S. senator, returned to Medford Friday from a swing throughout the state in behalf of his candidacy for the state treasurer's job. He said committees for him have been organized in Portland, Klamath Falls, Bend, Salem, Astoria and Lebanon.

"Fine enthusiasm" for his candidacy has been noted, he said, and has been supported by influential backing.

Committee chairmen in the cities named will be L. R. Henderson, Portland; Jimm Kern Jr., Klamath Falls; Clifford Harold, Salem; Dr. O. W. Lindbergh, Astoria; and Wendell Grano, Lebanon. A chairman will be named soon in Bend, he said.

Charles D. Wheeler of the weekly Capital Press, Salem, will aid Robinson in the campaign as publicity director. He has a wide acquaintanceship in Oregon, particularly the eastern portion, Robinson said.

One of Three From Here
Miss Holtz, whose home address is 2121 Jackson boulevard, Medford, will be one of three candidates from Medford seeking state-at-large election to the GOP convention. The others are At-

torney William McAllister, former legislator, and Robert Elliott, chairman of the state Republican Central committee.

Miss Holtz' registration did not show up on the registration books of the county clerk here because she is now on a tour of active duty with the Women's Army Corps, in Frankfurt, Germany, and her registration was handled through the secretary of state's office in Salem.

Her parents are Mr. and Mrs. John H. Holtz of the Jackson boulevard address. She is a 1945 graduate of the University of Wisconsin and is currently working for a Ph. D. degree at Columbia university in public law and government. She has been spending several months in France, Germany and England for material for her degree, but was recently recalled to temporary active duty in the WAC reserves.

Was in Service
Miss Holtz first entered service in September, 1943, and served during the war in a number of capacities, both in this country and overseas. She was discharged in May, 1946, and worked in Chicago, New York and Minneapolis.

She entered the WAC reserves in February, 1950, receiving a commission as second lieutenant in July, and was on active duty for a short time that year.

Her other interests have included school and athletic activities and Girl Scout work including being a senior counselor at the Scouts Low Echo camp, Lake O' Woods. She is a member of the Wisconsin Alumni association, American Legion, American Academy of Political Science, Public Law and Government club at Columbia university, the national ski patrol and the Columbia university chorus and University Ski club.

New Location Possible For The Dalles Bridge

The Dalles — (U.P.) — Wasco County Judge Ward Webber reported to officials here Saturday that a compromise settlement can possibly be reached with the federal government to permit the construction of The Dalles bridge at a new site.

Judge Webber is in Washington, D.C., conferring with members of the Oregon congressional delegation and the army engineers regarding compensation to the county for the extra expense involved in rebuilding the bridge at a new location.

He indicated that the negotiations will probably continue with the army engineers in Portland at a later date.

Construction of The Dalles dam necessitated the re-location of the bridge.

The four parallel ridges of the Coast range north of San Francisco bay are named, from east to west, the Yolo, Napa, Sonoma and Marin.
