Ah, but there is the rub. Many victims of the habit are weak-minded and weak-willed.

Well, what can you expect. From early infancy, when the neighborhood Sairee gamp harried the uneducated mother into plying the infant with castor oil, the poor geeks have been taught that a "good" physic is indispensable in the prevention or treatment of any ailment. For a doctor to question or ridicule this traditional idea is equivalent to
