Police Save 60 In Hotel Blaze

San Francisco — (U.P.) — The lives of 60 persons were saved during a \$35,000 fire in a three-story Mission district hotel Saturday because of the bravery of five policemen.

Four of the officers were overcome by smoke while leading the occupants to safety. The three-alarm blaze was controlled by 75 firemen.

Two officers turned in the fire alarm after they investigated a burglar alarm in a furniture store on the main floor of the hotel building. The policemen rushed to the aid of sleeping residents and were joined by three other officers, who turned on police-car sirens to awaken those still asleep.

Overcome by smoke were James Herlihy, 31; Andrew Kristensen, 27; Special Policeman George Bowen, 57, and Tim Richardson, 24. Patrolman Roy Hooper, 30, was uninjured. None of the 60 guests nor any of the fire fighters were injured.
