Our congratulations to the Rogue River Chieftains and Coach M. C. Busack for winning the state B basketball championship. It was a job well done and keeps the title in Jackson county for another year.

Rogue River by gaining the B schools' most valued bunting in basketball became the second team in history to gain the state title twice. The feat had not been accomplished since the great Belfountain quint of 1936 and 1937 took the top B prize.

FOUR OUT OF FIVE

Rogue River's 1952 triumph was the third straight by a Jackson county quint in the state event and was the fourth in five years for clubs from this county. Jacksonville won in 1948, Rogue River in 1950 and 1952 and Phoenix in 1951. Such achievement certainly gives Southern Oregon prestige and indicates the stature of the Jackson county "B" circuit.

This year's Rogue River championship was of considerable significance to Busack in his first year as a high school head man.

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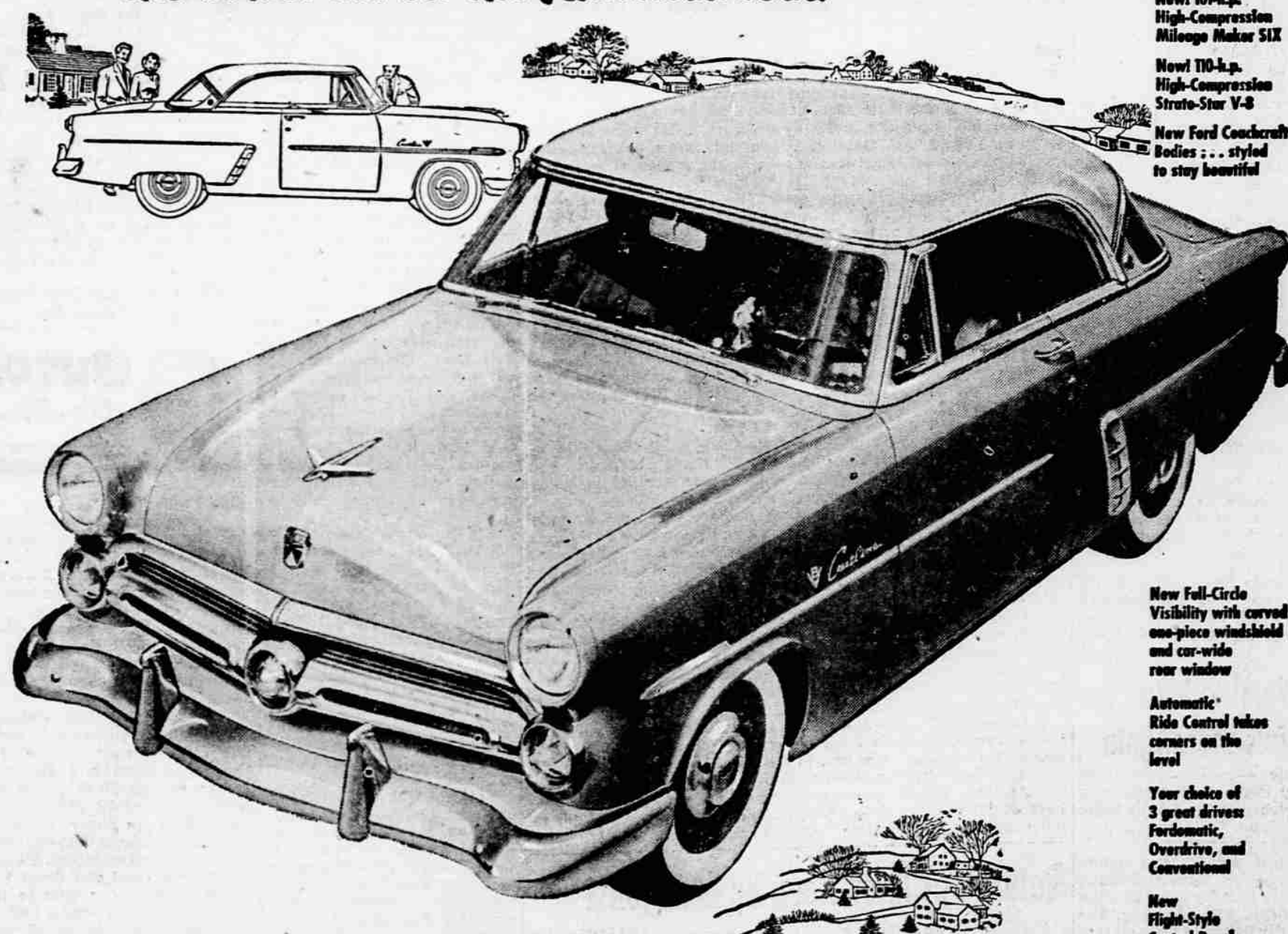


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
