

Vocational Training Still Available To Disabled Vets

Vocational rehabilitation training is still available to veterans who were disabled during World War II. In spite of the fact that most veterans no longer can begin training under the GI bill, it has been announced by the Veterans Administration.

According to the VA, two entirely different laws are involved, and some disabled veterans have believed that the termination of their benefits under the BI bill also terminated their rights to vocational rehabilitation.

Under Public Law 16

Rehabilitation training for disabled veterans, the VA said, is provided for under Public Law 16, the vocational rehabilitation act, which is still available. The only requirement is that training must be completed by July 25, 1956. This would permit the beginning of a two-year school course, for example, as late as July, 1954.

However, any disabled veteran requiring 48 months of training should make application of the VA immediately, in order to start training before July, 1952.

ment Act, the so-called GI bill, expired for most World War II veterans on July 25, 1951, which was the final cut-off date for starting training for all veterans discharged before July 25, 1947.

The VA said any World War II veteran, or Korean veteran,

with a service-connected disability, is entitled to apply to the VA for training, and he will be allowed to enroll if it is determined that he is in need of vocational rehabilitation and is otherwise eligible.

Korean veterans, the VA

pointed out, need not actually have served in Korea, so long as their service on active duty has been since June 27, 1950.

Disabled veterans of either World War II or the Korean campaign can apply for rehabilitation training at any VA office.

Washington Treasurer Would Be Governor

Olympia—(U.P.)—State Treasurer Tom Martin prepared Wednesday to launch his campaign as Democratic candidate for governor in the 1952 elections.

Martin announced his candidacy at a meeting of the Thurston county Democratic women's club Tuesday night. He is the first candidate of either major party to toss his hat in the ring. The 52-year-old official said he decided to take the step after "being urged to do so by thousands of persons all over the state."

"I have been associated with government for many years in various important capacities and feel I am well qualified for the position of governor," he said.

Atlantic Naval Forces Ready To Handle Enemy

Ottawa, Ont.—(U.P.)—Adm. Lynde D. McCormick, seagoing counterpart of Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower in the NATO, said Tuesday night that his sea forces now could "handle" the surface units of any potential enemy.

The supreme Allied naval commander in the Atlantic warned, however, that "the idea that we have enough naval forces for war would be a dangerous one."

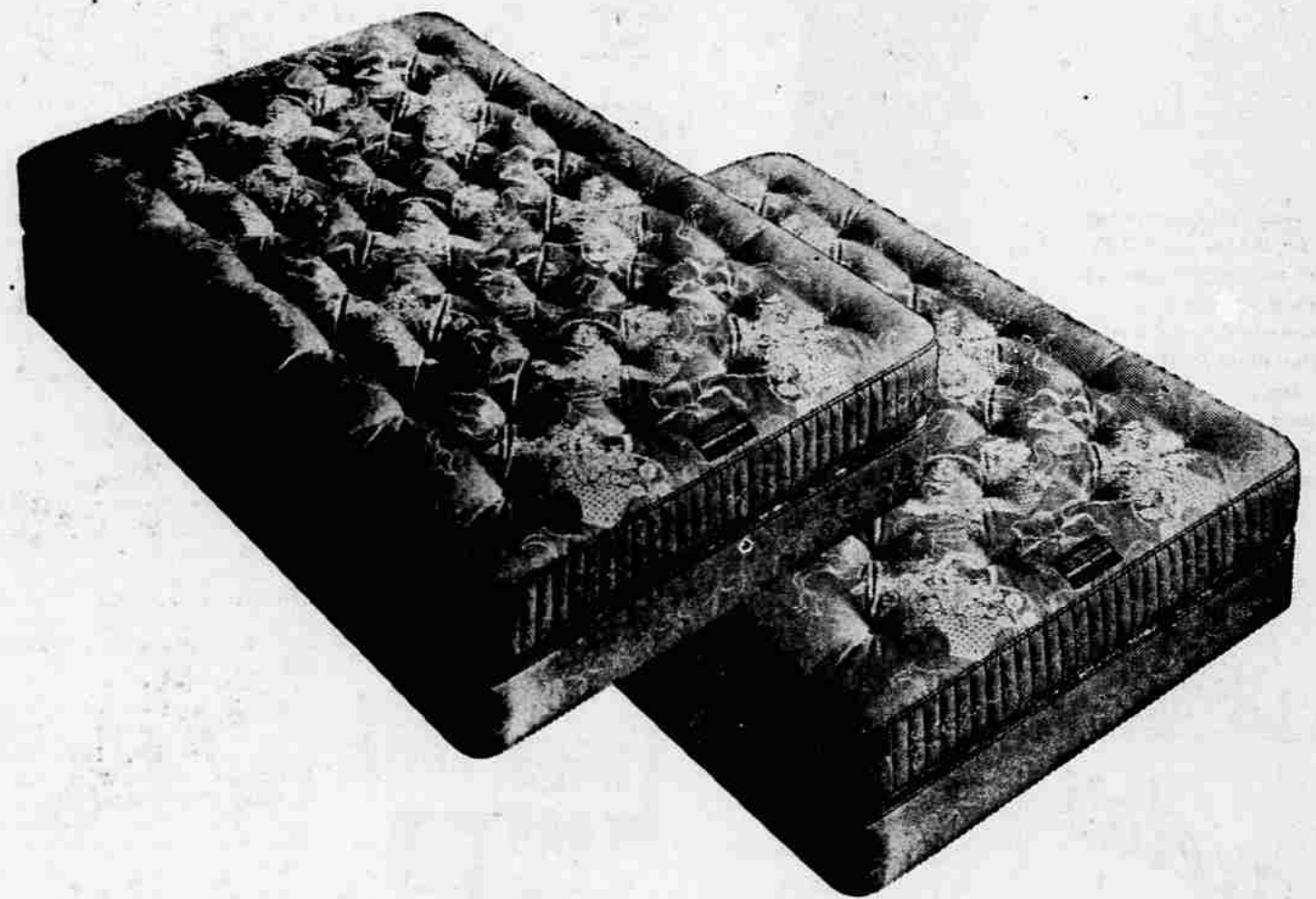

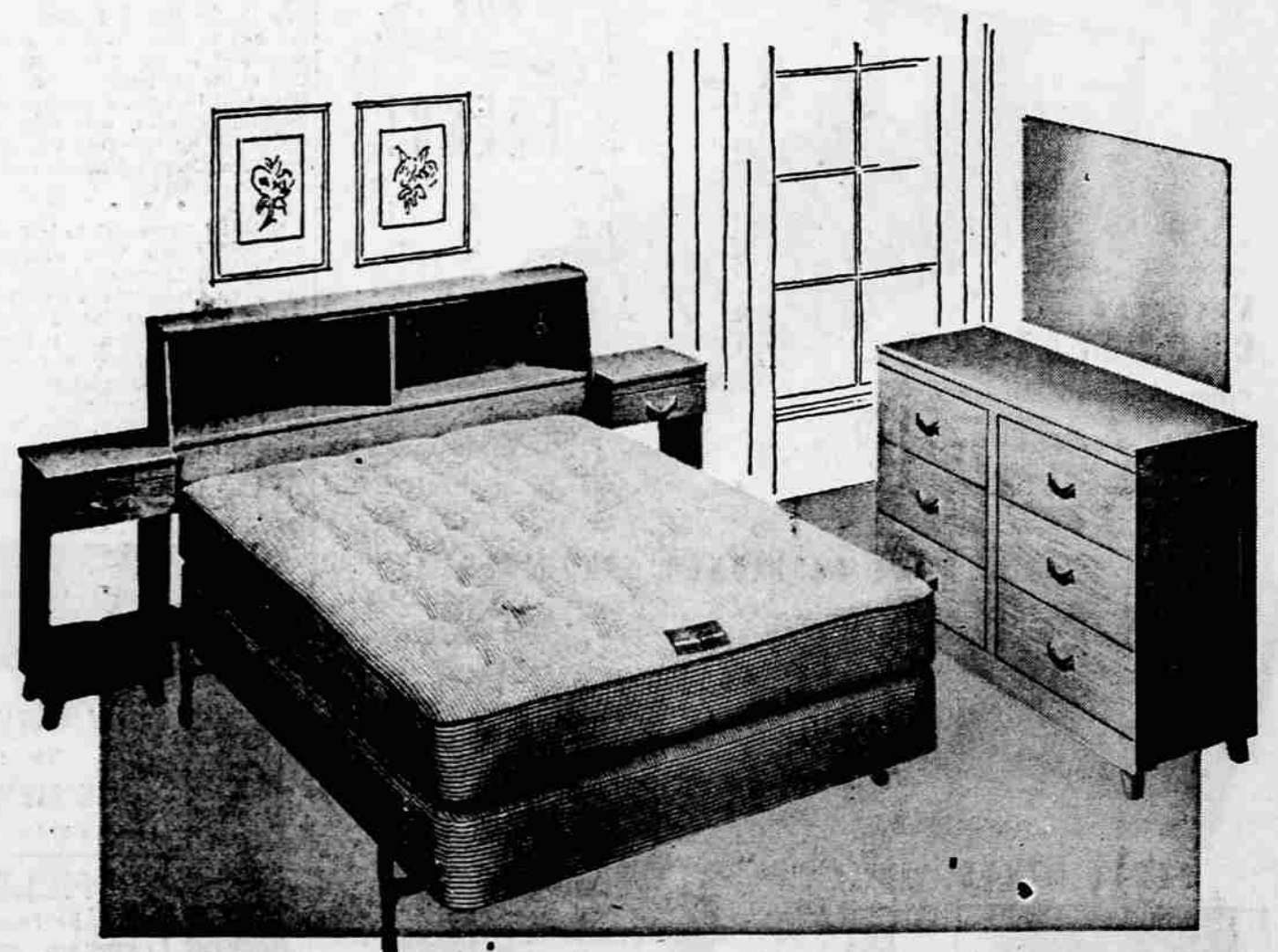
