FROM A SHILLING TO A FIN

A century ago when a shilling talked—12½ cents, that was—the doctor not only labelled the trouble salt rheum but probably gave the patient a supply of saline without extra charge. A little later, when almanacs attained wide circulation, it became known as tetter and it set the victim back four bits—50c, that was—to have it so called.

For some reason or other the name eczema ultimately became more popular—it means, says Webster, to boil out. What tetter means, who knows? Webster just loses one in the Old German and Lithuanian words.

After World War I a lot of doctors became specialists overnight—it was their only alternative to starting again from scratch to build a practice—and one of the tricks of the trade was calling eczema dermatitis at \$5 and up.

Well, dermatitis means skin inflammation and it is at least as good as any other name, maybe worth the fancy price you

Yankee Wiseacre pay for it. I have open on my desks no less than seven authoritative medical textbooks, whose views or descriptions of eczema I am trying to digest. After an hour's study of the works of these dermatologists I'm not sure whether I feel more frustrated than nettled—probably nettled.

For the present perhaps I had better say no more about the skin specialists. Heaven knows I have few friends left in the profession.

One textbook (Sutton) published 1937, says "the essential cause of eczema is unknown." Another (Pusey) published in 1917, gives two full pages of causes, constitutional and local, but says no more than Sutton says in seven words.

It remained for Brady (who else?) to give the world his monograph (and I'm not kidding) on eczema, which elucidates the subject in the author's well known manner. If you want a copy of the monograph, all you have to do, as the television salesman says, is (1) ask for it in writing and (2) inclose with your request a stamped envelope bearing your name and address. 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Anti-\$2 Bill Group Fails To Halt Print

Washington — (U.P.) — The United States may be headed for \$32,000,000 worth of trouble. At least, superstitious persons and other enemies of the \$2 bill think so. An Anti-\$2 bill group failed to block the printing of 16,000,000 more of the notes planned for the coming fiscal year.

During a House appropriations subcommittee hearing, Rep. Benjamin F. James (R., Pa.) said he had received only 10 of the bills in 25 years and has kept them all. He suggested it would be cheaper to do away with the \$2 notes and save on engraving plates, forms and records.

Mrs. Georgia Neese Clark, treasurer of the United States, came to the rescue of the bill which bears the portrait of Thomas Jefferson. She and Walter L. Funk, budget chief in her office, said the bill is still in demand, especially in New England, and that 33,742,133 bills are in use.

Although there are many more—exceeding one billion—\$1 bills in circulation, the \$2 bills won the day after explaining it "just costs half as much to issue one \$2 bill as it does two \$1 bills."
