

New Jet Endurance Mark Believed Set

Neuberg, Germany — (U.P.) Two U. S. Air Force F-84 Thunderjets landed here Tuesday after setting what Air Force officials believed was a new endurance record of 2,008 miles without refueling.

The flight spanned seven nations and took 4 hours and 48 minutes, indicating an average speed of slightly more than 418 miles per hour.

The Air Force said previous records would have to be checked before an official jet endurance record could be claimed. But a spokesman said it was the first time that such a plane was known to have covered more than 2,000 miles without refueling. Normal range of an F-84 is about 1,000 miles.

Double-Parker Liable for Damages

Chicago—(U.P.)—A double-parker is liable for damages if his car holds another car captive and inconveniences the owner, according to the Commerce Clearing House.

The organization, which disseminates business and tax law news, quoted a New York court decision on double parking. The judge likened the position of the motorist to the "captive audience" of a transit company. Such audiences recently won the right in court to be free of commercial radio broadcasts while traveling in public conveyances.

A Nichols' Worth of— Comment On This and That

Washington — (U.P.) — Cherry blossom time is almost here. That means, in Washington, the annual cherry blossom festival complete with a princess from each state and a queen ruling over all, thousands of visitors, and millions of beautiful blossoms on the cherry trees around the Tidal Basin.

We got the cherry trees from Japan. A gift. In 1908 Yukio Ozaki was the mayor of Tokyo. He wanted to give something to the United States. Seems that President Theodore Roosevelt had helped engineer the end of the Russo-Japanese war in 1905. Arranged the meeting which ended with the Treaty of Plymouth.

Ozaki sent the cherry trees. Three thousand trees which would blossom but produce no fruit. But oh, so beautiful. Shipment Infested. The shipment was bug-infested. The Department of Agriculture said they could not be planted in the United States. They were burned.

Hurt feelings were salved and Japan sent another shipment of cherry trees to Washington. This time they were bug-free. Under the direction of Mrs. William Howard Taft, wife of the then president, the trees were planted around the Tidal Basin. The trees grew and grew and are still growing. They produce nice blossoms every year. They bring lots of people to town. The visitors spend much money during festival time. The festival is a profitable affair.

No Cooperation. A few years ago the weather man didn't cooperate with the committee in charge of festival festivities. He brought out the blossoms ahead of time. A year later the weather was cold enough to retard the blossoms beyond festival dates. The committee went into a tizzy; now it may have the situation well in hand.

There seems to be a needle they can put into a tree to control a bloom. If a frost comes, the bloom can be saved. If the flower wants to come ahead of time, the flowers can be held up a bit.

This country thanked Japan for the trees, resisted the impulse to chop them down during World War II, and our people enjoy the beauty they produce. And we're willing to share that beauty.

En route to Japan now are 55 cuttings from the Tidal Basin trees. Seems they are to be used to restore a famous Tokyo cherry grove which was depleted for wood during the war.

Although clay tile has been used by man for dwellings and churches for more than 4,000 years, floor and wall tile was not manufactured in the United States until 1845.
