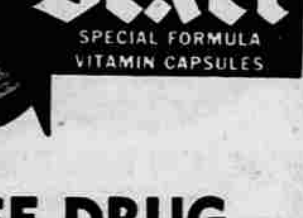
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Washington Issues Tideland Permits

Olympia--(U.P.)--The Washington state land office is continuing to issue permits to drill for oil on submerged tidelands, Land Commissioner Jack Taylor said Thursday.

Taylor, along with Gov. Arthur B. Langlie and Attorney General Smith Troy, does not recognize the federal government's recent claim to ownership of the three-mile strip of submerged lands along the coast. "We will continue to issue permits as in the past," Taylor said, "and if the federal government wants to do something about it, we will carry the fight on from there."
