OLD-FASHIONED IDEAS ARE SOMETIMES BEST
(Q) "I am nearly 16 years old. My mother and I disagree on so many things that I decided to write to you. Once a week, my girl friend and I go to a roller skating rink. It closes at 11:30 p.m. but we leave early to get the 11:20 bus. That gets me home about 12:30. My mother thinks I should take the 10 p.m. bus. This isn't the only time I have to be home early. Whenever I go out, I have to be the first to leave. My mother also has old-fashioned ideas about the boys' drinking beer. Should they be permitted to drink beer at a party? I am having a "sweet sixteen" party and I want to serve beer to the boys but my mother doesn't approve. Please help me."

(A) Sometimes "old-fashioned" ideas are best in the long run. It is better to be conservative and do things that are above all criticism than to be so "modern" that you lay yourself open to criticism.

I heartily agree with your mother that you and a friend should not be leaving the roller skating rink so late and coming home on a bus that does not get you home until midnight or later. That is much too late for two young girls to be on a bus alone.

Would it be possible for you to arrange to have your father and your friend's father bring you home in a car so you would not have to leave so early? If they took turns, it would not be so hard on them.

When you are met and brought home by a father, there is little likelihood of criticism. But, if

you must use public transportation, there are plenty of people who will criticize you and your parents for allowing you to be "running around" so late at night.

Agrees With Mother Again
As for serving beer at a "sweet sixteen" party, there too, I agree with your mother. It may seem old-fashioned to you to serve only soft drinks but it is certainly smarter.

While some of them may be permitted by their parents to drink beer, there are others, I am sure, whose parents are as conservative as yours and who would be "shocked" if their sons were served beer at a girl's home.

If you give the group plenty of good food, they will not miss the beer. And you will be playing safe. If any of the boys feel that your party was a "flop" because of it, scratch them off your list.

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Your Health and Its Care

HEALTHY BABY HAS NO TEETHING TROUBLES

In the letter of the month (printed here Thursday, March 20, I hope), the young mother said her two-year-old daughter, raised according to the *Brady Baby Book*—for which send 25c a n d stamped, self-addressed envelope, has never had colic, teething troubles or a dose of physic.

What! Not even any castor oil? You ignorant ones will wonder how she managed to keep the fishwives out of the act in the first few weeks. But if you can spare two bits and s. a. e. even you may learn how to manage it. As I always say, the dumbest, most credulous creature is teachable. And it is hard to conceive of a creature so dumb and credulous about the care and feeding of infants as the average high school or college graduate.

Some years ago there was a brisk flurry of publicity for a public school somewhere in the middle west that was trying to establish a course in the care and feeding of infants. I haven't heard even a whisper about it lately. I wonder what ever happened to the idea? Did the dumb parents rise up in arms and stop the nonsense? Or did the powerful interests decide that such instruction of prospective parents might hurt their business?

In the nineteenth century it was a common custom to keep young infants doped with opium—camphorated tincture of opium otherwise called paregoric. Fifty or sixty years ago it was easier to "quiet" or "soothe" the baby with a shot of opium in the form of paregoric or the stronger tincture of opium otherwise called laudanum, than to bathe, powder, rub the back, change wet diaper, feed or attend to other simple wants to keep the baby happy.

From the queries received it appears that some parents of young infants even give them wine or liquor on the same pretext, and some parents of older children give the children aspirin as though this pain-killer were a remedy for anything.

As a matter of fact there is rarely or ever a good reason why a baby should ever have "colic," "teething trouble" or

any kind of physic, all the old grannies and busybody neighbors to the contrary notwithstanding. The first dose of castor oil so often inflicted on the baby by these well-meaning but ignorant folk—ignorant of the care and feeding of infants—is responsible for much of the trouble ascribed to "colic" and so seriously disturbs the natural automatic regulation of the stomach and bowel function that constiveness ensues. The unhappy baby is punished for this with more physics, or enemas, all of which are irritating and injurious to the delicate digestive tract.

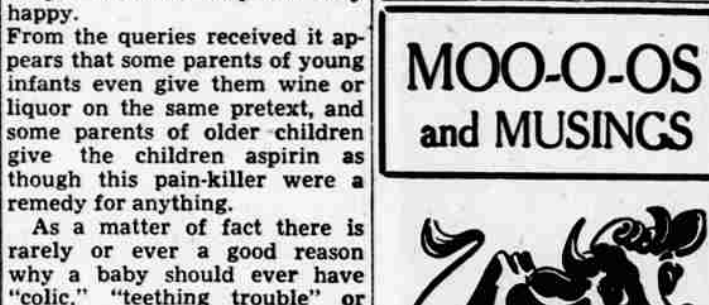
The cutting of teeth in a baby is painless and should never be regarded as an explanation for any illness the baby may have.

Bank Aiding Employee Voter Registration

The First National Bank of Portland is conducting a statewide non-partisan campaign this week to assist all its eligible staff members to register to vote in the primary and general elections this year.

There are more than 2,500 staff members in the 46 branches and 18 offices of affiliated banks, according to F. N. Belgrano Jr., Portland, president of the bank. The firm has assumed responsibility of seeing that all employees eligible to vote, regardless of party, understand the rules regarding registration, and are given an opportunity to exercise the privilege.

Belgrano added that bank employees will be given time off to register if it is inconvenient for them to do so during non-working hours.

The deadline for registering to vote in the primary election is April 15.
