

\$29,500,000 Allotted For Second Quarter Projects in Oregon

Washington — (U.P.) — The National Production administration has announced approval of more than \$7 billion worth of industrial expansion for the second quarter year throughout the nation, representing a total of 1458 projects.

Oscar R. Ewing, federal security administrator, at the same time announced that some 500 school and hospital projects may be permitted to resume construction after being held up for lack of materials. He said allocations of critical materials would be made for the third and fourth quarters.

Seven cities, including Portland and Seattle, have been designated by defense authorities as employment hardship areas, Ewing said, and will be given especially lenient treatment.

The NPA said the second quarter materials allotments included \$29,500,000 for Oregon projects. Biggest of these is a \$7,373,902 paper mill installation for the St. Helens Pulp and Paper company, St. Helens. Second largest was \$5,111,250 for a lumber installation at the Weyerhaeuser Timber Co., Springfield.

Mrs. Hagberg died in a Portland sanitarium Sunday about four hours after she was injured in a two-car collision.

She was thrown from a car driven by her daughter, Mrs. Marion Hilden Hoss, 48, also of Gresham, when it was struck by a vehicle driven by the Rev. John Allen Phinney, 33.
