Around Hollywood

Hollywood — (U.P.) — Hollywood's gone back to the era of the flickers. Ray Milland is starring in the first movie made without dialogue in 25 years.

He will be seen, but not heard, in "The Thief," in which absolutely nobody says anything.

Aline Mosby is an improvement over some current pictures in which everybody says too much.

This talkless epic is being directed and written by Russell Rouse and Clarence Green, who created "The Well," for producer Harry Popkin.

Rouse, who can talk, explains that he wanted to get back to silent movies because movies don't move these days, they're just talkies.

"This is a visual medium, but Hollywood has been getting away from it," he says. "We decided to conceive a story that could be best told without dialogue."

"After all, some of the best moments in movies are when nothing is said — such as the bomber scene with Dana Andrews in 'The Best Years of Our Lives.'"

Something Lost

"Something has been lost in the making of movies. The camera now is just a photographic device. It should be used as a dramatic device, which we shall do."

"The Thief," he says, is a suspense story about a thief that "is subjective . . . you understand his inner conflict . . . what kind of a man he is."

Nobody talks in the picture because the thief "is always alone." There's a plot reason for this, but Rouse squirms that that's a secret.

"Nobody says anything to Mil-

land because there's no reason for him to carry on any conversation," he says. The only sounds will be normal sound effects. When he walks down a city street, there'll be the usual hub-bub of voices and auto sounds."

Milland, he says, was slightly confused when he read the script and couldn't find any lines to say.

"Then he got very excited about it," says the writer-director.

"Others in town are, too. But some think we're daft. They say, 'you'll have narration, of course,' or 'there must be subtitles.'"

"There is no narration, no subtitles, no talk, period."

The picture will be shot on location in the East. It will be released in September at a premiere where all will be silence except for the crunching of popcorn bags.

Payment of Ransom To Red China Approved

CIGARETTE SMOKING AND CANCER OF LUNG

Lest any one think I'm prejudiced let me say here that I'm a pipe smoker.

Let me say, too, that I'm a moderate smoker. Except twenty or thirty days in the year when the bowling greens are wet I neither smoke nor want a smoke until after lunch. If there's no bowling in the afternoon then there's no smoking in my playroom that day. I have my first smoke of the day after dinner in the evening, sometimes immediately and sometimes an hour or two after dinner. Through the evening I smoke perhaps three pipefuls.

Finally, although a woman smoking on the street or while driving her car seems as unlovely as one who casually drops into a bar, everything we can say about the effects of smoking upon health applies to both sexes.

In recent years there have been more frequent references in medical literature to cancer of the lung in heavy smokers. Dr. A. reports a series of such cases encountered in his practice in ten or twenty years. Dr. B., perhaps with time between patients heavy on his hands, makes a "survey" of recent medical literature and tabulates the salient features of a dozen or more cases of lung cancer in heavy smokers. Dr. C. examines the available data and publishes in *Thorax* his views of the problem. All of this tends to give one the impression that (a) we know the nature and cause of cancer and (b) that something in tobacco smoke may cause cancer to develop in the bronchial passages or lungs.

We know nothing of the kind. It is far to assume that cancer of the lung is more frequent recognized or diagnosed today than it was fifty years ago, but that is all. It remains to be determined whether heavy smokers, and particularly cigarette smokers, are any more liable to have cancer of the lung than light smokers, pipe or cigar smokers or non-smokers.

Meanwhile, it can do no harm to consider these facts:

1. Whether the nicotine, carbon monoxide, one or more aldehydes, such as furfural, methyl (wood) alcohol, arsenic, pyridine, hydrocyanic acid or tar—all of which have been found in the smoke — is the injurious factor is still a question of opinion.
2. In any case the effects of

smoking will depend on the area of mucous membrane the smoke reaches. In an ordinary puff the surface of palate, tongue, lining of cheeks and floor of mouth — perhaps 7 or 8 square inches — is exposed to the smoke. If the smoker inhales the smoke reaches the lining of the entire nose-throat and perhaps even penetrates the larynx (voice box) into trachea (windpipe) and bronchial passages almost if not quite into the air cells of the lungs. Thus inhaling means that an enormously increased absorbing surface is exposed to the smoke.

3. For this reason, the first precaution for a smoker to take, no matter whether his or her trouble be cough, duodenal ulcer complex, cold feet, thromboangiitis obliterans (Buerger's disease), cardiovascular disturbance or whatnot, is: Don't inhale.

Remember the individual is not ill nor in any danger, but just — well, say the neuro-muscular machinery is not functioning as smoothly as it should. And don't infer from the mask-like expression that there's anything like in the attic—if you approach the individual from that point of view he or she is likely to make a monkey of you.
