Last Minute Plan Slated To Block Box Canyon Dam

Newport, Wash. — (U.P.) — A last-minute legal maneuver intended to block construction of Box Canyon dam was scheduled Thursday by a group of power consumers and taxpayers who failed in an earlier attempt to halt the project.

J. K. Cheadle, Spokane, attorney for the Pend Oreille county Citizens' Protective association, said he planned to file suit in Superior Court against the Pend Oreille public utility district. The PUD has permission to build the dam on the Pend Oreille river near Lone.

Injunction Sought
Cheadle said the association seeks an injunction to stop the letting of a construction contract for the \$16,000,000 project. Bids for the project were to be opened Thursday at 1:30 p. m.

The suit would be based on a contention that the PUD is getting power from the Bonneville Power administration cheaper than could be produced at Box Canyon, he said.

Summer's First Sign; KF Has Grass Fire

Klamath Falls — (U.P.) — Klamath Falls firemen wondered Thursday just what time of year it is in Southern Oregon.

Firemen received a call Wednesday to put out a grass fire in a place where the snow was on the ground a week ago. They discovered the spot was where they were unable to burn grass during a fire-prevention campaign in the middle of last summer—one of the hottest and driest summers on record.

Friends Confident Taft Has Nothing To Fear From Eisenhower

Washington — (U.P.) — Sen. Robert A. Taft's friends are confident the man from Ohio has nothing to fear from Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower's homecoming to campaign.

The word in Washington is that the general is likely to return. Taft's friends indicated his return would be more welcome than otherwise. They believe the senator would out-hit the general on the issues of the day.

Taft Knows More

"Taft knows more about the issues than does Eisenhower," Sen. John W. Bricker (R., O.) said in response to questions. "I think the general's managers would prefer now that he remain in Europe as long as possible."

Rep. Clarence J. Brown (R., O.) said the people had a lot of questions they'd want to ask Ike.

"Republicans will not be stampeded into nominating any candidate who fails, or refused, to tell the people where he stands on public issues," Brown said.

Labor Stand Eyed

"They are interested in knowing whether Gen. Eisenhower will support the Taft-Hartley act or demand its repeal, whether he is for FEPC, civil rights, or against it, whether he approves

or disapproves of the conduct of the Korean war.

"These are just a few of the questions most Republicans will want answered to their satisfaction before the Republican national convention opens July 7."

Eisenhower's friends contend that he has made a record on the issues of the day although they concede that many of his policy statements are more than a year old.

Campaign Type Speculated

Whether he should come back to campaign has been the subject of constant discussion among practical politicians. The subject of much speculation is the type of campaign Eisenhower would make if he did return. Eisenhower's platform manner is terrific. When the general arises before a great audience he is very likely to have it cheering his way after a few minutes of oratory.

Whether he is as good as that in the more intimate forms of campaigning remains to be seen. It is in the smaller communities and before the smaller audiences that campaigners are likely to be confronted directly with specific questions on the issues of the day.

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Enjoy TUNA ROLL-UPS

This delicious Lenten Dish was developed by Betty Crocker's Staff at General Mills

Preheat oven to 450°. Sift together 2 cups sifted GOLD MEDAL Flour, 3 tsp. double-action baking powder, 1 tsp. salt. Pour into a measuring cup (but don't stir together) 1/2 cup WESSON Oil, 1/2 cup milk. Then pour all at once into the flour. Stir with fork until mixture cleans side of bowl and rounds up into a ball. Smooth by kneading dough about 10 times without additional flour. Place the dough between 2 sheets waxed paper (12 in. square).

Roll out until dough reaches edges of paper. Peel off top paper. Cut dough into 9 squares. Make tuna filling: flake 1 can (1 cup) WHITE STAR Brand TUNA; mix together with 1/2 cup minced celery, 1 egg, unbeaten. Spread 2 tbsp. tuna filling over each square. Roll up each square as for jelly roll.

Place roll-ups, sealed side down, on ungreased cookie sheet. Bake 10 to 15 minutes in hot oven (450°). Serve with hot sauce made by bringing to a boil (over low heat, stirring constantly) one 10 1/2-oz. can condensed cream of mushroom, celery or chicken soup and 2 tbsp. chopped parsley. Garnish with parsley or paprika. Serves 6 to 9.
