The original Imperial State Crown, containing diamonds worth more than \$2,500,000 is safely lodged in London, but an authentic replica made by court jewelers, using brilliant-cut white sapphires in place of diamonds, is now on exhibition in the window of Chapman Jewelers, 109 E. Main street.

The original Imperial State Crown was made at the request of Queen Victoria and contains the Black Prince's ruby and the second gem cut from the fabulous Star of India diamond. It was worn by King George VI at the opening of Parliament, on Lord Mayor's Day and on other state occasions.

State To Rest Case Against Negro Man

Bellingham—(AP)—The prosecution was expected to rest its case Thursday against Melvin W. Jones, 23-year-old Louisiana Negro accused of strangling Howard F. Haling last fall.

The first degree murder trial opened in Whatcom county Superior Court Wednesday, when Defense Attorney David Rhea acknowledged Jones "did throttle" the 57-year-old stationmaster at Sumas, Wash.

"Jones throttled Haling in a struggle that followed the defendant's refusal to perpetrate a felony," Rhea said in his opening statement. "After the struggle, Jones realized he had gone too far."

Eugene Plane Crash Fatal to Two Men

Eugene—(AP)—Two men were killed late Wednesday when a two-place Aeronca Champion plane crashed in Amazon marsh near here.

Donald E. Breeden, 26, of Eugene, a passenger in the plane, was killed instantly. The pilot of the craft, Robert Lyon, about 30, also of Eugene, died an hour later.

Witnesses said the plane had just taken off from the Bev's Flying Service field when it appeared to stall or spin-in and crash.

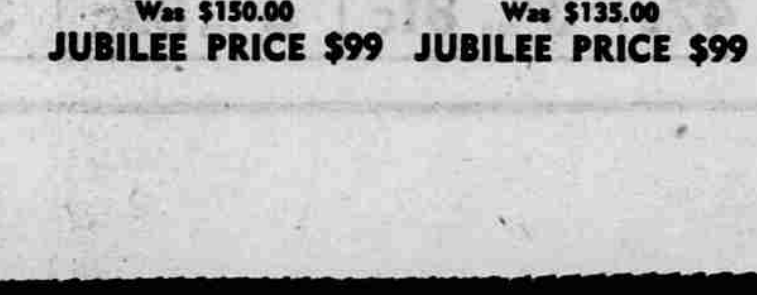
